Main Points:

- The Person – Noah: Rest
- The Protection: Give Room
- The Process: Remember
- The Promise: Rainbow

In the process of in-between, the key is to remember things.

Digging Deeper:

Revelation

- Why is it important to “walk close with the Lord”?
- Why does “Noah” represent “rest”?
- What does the word “Ark” represent?
- Why is it important to “remember” things while in the midst of the “process”?

In every in-between there are lessons to be learned.

Interpretation

- How do we “embrace rest”?
- How does knowing what the word “Ark” means, help provide us with protection?
- What does it mean to “give room” during this time?
- How did Noah prepare for the process?
- Why is it important to spend a lot of time “looking up” when going through storms?

Application

- How is your “walk with the Lord” today?
- Are you finding “rest” in the midst of your “protection”?
- How are you dealing with the “process”?
- As you work through this “process” write down some things you “remember” God’s protection in other times.
- Take time to write down life lessons God is teaching you in this time.
