

SHORT & SWEET – NEWNESS OF LIFE

Matthew 28:6

Romans 6:4b

...just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

Luke 24:15, 17, 19

Luke 24:27, 32

27 And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself....

32 They said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the Scriptures?"

Isaiah 52:13–53:12 [COM]

13 Behold, my Servant shall deal wisely and prosper; he shall be lifted up and highly exalted.

14 But he didn't begin that way. At first everyone was appalled. My Servant was beaten and bloodied, so disfigured one would scarcely know it was a person standing there - beaten beyond recognition as a human.

15 Nations all over the world will be in awe, taken aback, kings shocked into silence when they see him. For what was unheard of they'll see with their own eyes, what was unthinkable they'll have right before them. So shall he cleanse many nations.

1 But, oh, how few believe it! Who would have thought God's saving power would look like this? To whom has it been revealed?

2 For the Servant of God grew up in the LORD's presence like a tender green shoot, like a root in dry ground. There was nothing beautiful or majestic about his appearance, nothing to attract us to him.

3 He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with deepest grief; And like one from whom men hide their face he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

4 Surely it was our griefs he bore, our sorrows and pains that he carried. And we thought he was stricken, smitten by God, afflicted for his own sins!

5 But it was our sins that did that to him, that ripped and tore and crushed him - it was for our sins that he was wounded! He was bruised for our guilt and iniquities. He took the punishment upon himself to give us peace and well-being. And by his stripes from the scourging and whippings he suffered we are healed.

6 All of us like sheep have gone astray - each of us has turned to his own way. But the LORD has laid on him the guilt and iniquity of us all.

7 He was oppressed and he was afflicted, yet he was submissive and opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, he never said a word. Like a sheep that is silent before its shearers, he stood silent before the ones condemning him.

8 From prison and trial they led him away to his death. But who among the people of that day realized that he was cut off out of the land of the living for the transgression of my people, to whom the punishment of death was due?

9 He was buried like a criminal, but in a rich man's grave; even though he had never hurt a soul, nor ever allowed a single word that wasn't true to come out of his mouth.

10 But it was the will of the LORD to crush him with pain and put him to grief. If he would render himself as an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the good pleasure of the LORD will prosper in his hand.

11 And when he sees all that is accomplished by the anguish of his soul, he shall be satisfied; and because of what he has experienced, my righteous Servant shall make many to be counted righteous before God, for he shall bear all their sins.

12 Therefore, I will give him the honors of one who is mighty and great because he has poured out his soul unto death. He was numbered with the transgressors, yet he himself bore the sins of many, and interceded for the transgressors and rebellious.
