THE STAR-STRUCK MAGI

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ²saying, “Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.” ³When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵They told him, “In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet: ⁶“And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.” ⁷Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. ⁸And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, “Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him.” ⁹After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. ¹¹And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. ¹²And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

THE TRUTH ABOUT WORLDLY WISDOM

1 Corinthians 1:18-30

1. IT IS ALWAYS ON ITS WAY OUT

As the Scriptures say, “I will destroy the wisdom of the wise and discard the intelligence of the intelligent.” ²⁰So where does this leave the philosophers, the scholars, and the world’s brilliant debaters? God has made the wisdom of this world look foolish. – 1 Corinthians 1:19-20 NLT

How can you say, “We are wise because we have the word of the Lord,” when your teachers have twisted it by writing lies? ⁹These wise teachers will fall into the trap of their own foolishness, for they have rejected the word of the Lord. Are they so wise after all? – Jeremiah 8:8-9 NLT

2. IT CAN ONLY TAKE YOU HALFWAY

For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe.

– 1 Corinthians 1:21 ESV

3. IT IS WAY TOO SHALLOW

Thus says the Lord: “Let not the wise man boast in his wisdom, let not the mighty man boast in his might, let not the rich man boast in his riches, ²⁴but let him who boasts boast in this, that he understands and knows me, that I am the Lord... – Jeremiah 9:23-24 ESV

...Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men. – 1 Corinthians 1:24-25 ESV

4. IT IS TOO NARROW AND EXCLUSIVE

Take a good look, friends, at who you were when you got called into this life. I don't see many of “the brightest and the best” among you, not many influential, not many from high-society families. Isn't it obvious that God deliberately chose men and women that the culture overlooks and exploits and abuses, chose these “nobodies” to expose the hollow pretensions of the “somebodies”? That makes it quite clear that none of you can get by with blowing your own horn before God. – 1 Corinthians 1:26-29 MSG

WHICH KING WILL YOU MEET THIS CHRISTMAS?

God has united you with Christ Jesus. For our benefit God made him to be wisdom itself. Christ made us right with God; he made us pure and holy, and he freed us from sin. – 1 Corinthians 1:30 NLT

3. Why do you think God included pagan astrologers in the Christmas story? What do you think made them leave everything and bring these great riches to the Christ child?
4. Do you think our response to Jesus is much like theirs when they saw him for the first time? Do you not see a difference? What can we learn from them?
5. What does the star, the Magi, the gifts, the worship, the prophecy, and yes, even the hostility, teach you about the significance of Jesus?
6. How is your spiritual journey to Christ like that of the Magi? What are the gifts you would like to offer to Christ? How would Jesus use them for his glory?
