# The Corinthian Problem & How to Develop Generous Love

#### 1. Don't equate it with <u>Religious Busyness</u>

Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal. <sup>2</sup> And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. <sup>3</sup> And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing. - 1 Corinthians 13:1-3 KJV

This spiritual knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. - 1 Corinthians 8:1

# 2. REJECT **SMALL-MINDEDNESS** IN OURSELVES

Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, <sup>5</sup> Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own...

- 1 Corinthians 13:4-5a KJV

# 3. EMBRACE <u>BIG-HEARTEDNESS</u> FOR OTHERS

[Charity] is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil; <sup>6</sup> Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth... - 1 Corinthians 13:5b-6 KJV

And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves; for charity shall cover the multitude of sins. - 1 Peter 4:8 KJV

#### 4. ADMIT IT IS IMPOSSIBLE WITHOUT CHRIST

[Charity] beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. - 1 Corinthians 13:7 KJV

This is real love—not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins. <sup>11</sup> Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other. - 1 John 4:10-11 NLT

#### 5. MIMIC THE GENEROSITY OF CHRIST

Charity never faileth: but whether there be prophecies, they shall fail; whether there be tongues, they shall cease; whether there be knowledge, it shall vanish away. <sup>9</sup> For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. <sup>10</sup> But when that which is perfect is come, then that which is in part shall be done away. <sup>11</sup> When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things. <sup>12</sup> For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known. <sup>13</sup> And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity. - 1 Corinthians 13:8-13 KIV

- 4. Explain the importance of honestly assessing our own propensity to sin when we are called upon to love others with neighbor-love (Read Matthew 7:1-5 for help here)
- 5. When you think of love "covering a multitude of sins," why must we be careful to not see this as covering up a problem? How do we cover the person more than the problem?
