The Two Ingredients for a Strong Marriage: Love and Respect

The Research and the Revelation

- The University of Washington studied 2000 couples for 20 years and found that LOVE and RESPECT are the two key ingredients.
- Shaunti Feldhahn asked a random sample of American males, "Would you rather be left alone
 and UNLOVED in the world or viewed as inadequate and DISRESPECTED by everyone?"
- Dr. Emerson Eggerichs asked 7000 people, "When in a conflict with your spouse do you feel UNLOVED or DISRESPECTED?"

...wives...even if any (husbands) are disobedient to the word, they may be won... as they observe your...RESPECTFUL behavior. - 1 Peter 3:1-2 NASB

Husbands, LOVE your wives and do not be embittered against them.

- Colossians 3:19 NASB

The Reaction When We Overlook Them

- 1. We Step on the **AIR HOSES**.
- 2. We Start the CRAZY CYCLE.

How to Ensure the Two Ingredients in Marriage

1. By Valuing **GOD'S DESIGN**.

(Jesus said) "Have you not read that He who created them from the beginning made them MALE and FEMALE?" - Matthew 19:4 NASB

2. By Embracing GOD'S CALL.

a. He Calls Me to Embrace MY SPOUSE'S GOOD WILL.

[A man] who is married is concerned about ... how he may please his wife, and [a wife] is concerned about...how she may please her husband. - 1 Corinthians 7:33-34 NASB

b. He Calls Me to Embrace <u>FRICTION IN MY</u> MARRIAGE.

But because sexual immorality is so common, each man should have his own wife, and each woman should have her own husband. ³ A husband should fulfill his marital responsibility to his wife, and likewise a wife to her husband. ⁴ A wife does not have the right over her own body, but her husband does. In the same way, a husband does not have the right over his own body, but his wife does. ⁵ Do not deprive one another sexually. ... However, if you do get married, you have not sinned... But such people will have trouble in this life, and I am trying to spare you. - 1 Corinthians 7:2-4, 28 HCSB

c. He Calls Me to Embrace MY CHRIST-HONORING STRENGTH.

Out of respect for Christ, be courteously reverent to one another. - Ephesians 5:21 MSG

d. He Calls Me to Embrace **MY ETERNAL REWARD**Over My Temporary Setback!

As slaves of Christ, do the will of God with all your heart. ⁷ Work with enthusiasm, as though you were working for the Lord rather than for people. ⁸ Remember that the Lord will reward each one of us for the good we do, whether we are slaves or free. ⁹ Masters, treat your slaves in the same way. Don't threaten them; remember, you both have the same Master in heaven, and he has no favorites.

- Ephesians 6:6-9 NLT
