OUR TWO FUNDAMENTAL RELATIONSHIPS

Jesus said, "'Love the Lord your God with all your passion and prayer and intelligence.' This is the most important, the first on any list. But there is a second to set alongside it: 'Love others as well as you love yourself.' These two commands are pegs; everything in God's Law and the Prophets hangs from them." – Matthew 22:37-40 (MSG)

- 1. Our <u>Vertical Relationships</u>
- 2. Our Horizontal Relationships

ROLE WITH IT! (How to keep the relationship while maintaining the roles)

²³ So if you are presenting a sacrifice at the altar in the Temple and you suddenly remember that someone has something against you, ²⁴ leave your sacrifice there at the altar. Go and be reconciled to that person. Then come and offer your sacrifice to God. – Matthew 5:23-24 (NLT)

Role #1: Child to Parent

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), ³ "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land." – Ephesians 6:1-3 (ESV)

• Embrace the Power of Honor-driven Obedience

Romans 1:28-30; 2 Timothy 3:1-5

• Enjoy the Blessing of **Quantity & Quality** of Life

Role #2: Parent to Child

Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord. – Ephesians 6:4 (ESV)

• Avoid Creating <u>Settled-Animosity</u>

Colossians 3:21

Balance Discipline With Encouragement

A rod and reproof impart wisdom, but a child who is unrestrained brings shame to his mother. – Proverbs 29:15 (NET)

- Balance Dependence With Independence
- Tie Everything To Your Christ-life

Role #3: Employee to Employer

⁵ Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, ⁶ not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, ⁷ rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man, ⁸ knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a bondservant or is free. – Ephesians 6:5-8 (ESV)

• Work For Your Employer As You Would For Christ

Role #4: Employer to Employee

Masters, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him. – Ephesians 6:9 (ESV)

- Accept Your Call To Mutual Responsibility
- Practice The Power of Managerial Restraint

How The Cross Harmonizes Both

Submitting to one another in the fear of Christ – Ephesians 5:21 (HCSB)
