I. God is a **GRACIOUS** Redeemer

I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel.

Genesis 3:15

God rejects

- 1. Adam & Eve's covering
- 2. Cain's offering
- 3. the World in Noah's day
- 4. the Tower of Babel

God accepts

- 5. Abel's offering
- 6. Noah's offering

III. God calls Abraham to <u>START</u> His Redemptive Plan

Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. ² And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. ³ I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.

Genesis 12:1-3

1. Abraham built altars in Shechem, Bethel, and Hebron - **Genesis 12 - 14**

Then the LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him. 8 From there he moved to the hill country on the east of Bethel and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east. And there he built an altar to the LORD and called upon the name of the LORD.

Genesis 12:7-8

So Abram moved his tent and came and settled by the oaks of Mamre, which are at Hebron, and there he built an altar to the LORD.

2. God "cut a covenant" with Abraham – **Genesis 15**

3. Abraham offers his one and only son – **Genesis 22**

"Abraham..... bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. ¹⁰Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to slaughter his son."
