The Season

Advent means "coming." This is the season of the Church Year when we remember that Christ will come again. He came once as a baby in Bethlehem and will return as King of kings and Lord of lords. The emphasis of the season is on preparation and watchfulness. The expectancy of Advent is fulfilled on Christmas.

The Candles

The candles symbolize Christ who is the light of the world. We pass the light of the candles just as we pass the light of Christ to others through the preaching of the Gospel. When the candles are all placed together on the chancel they serve as the focal point of the service.

The Service

Our service for tonight is an evening devotion with pieces of music developed in the Taizé Community in France. Taizé worship incorporates words of Scripture set to simple, repetitive musical refrains. The worshipper quickly can sing the piece from the heart and meditate on the words and works of God.



THE GATHERING


The cantor introduces the refrain and the congregation joins in singing repeatedly as the lights are placed before the altar.
