<sup>39</sup> When Moses reported this to all the Israelites, they mourned bitterly. <sup>40</sup> Early the next morning they set out for the highest point in the hill country, saying, "Now we are ready to go up to the land the LORD promised. Surely we have sinned!" <sup>41</sup> But Moses said, "Why are you disobeying the LORD's command? This will not succeed! <sup>42</sup> Do not go up, because the LORD is not with you. You will be defeated by your enemies, <sup>43</sup> for the Amalekites and the Canaanites will face you there. Because you have turned away from the LORD, he will not be with you and you will fall by the sword." <sup>44</sup> Nevertheless, in their presumption they went up toward the highest point in the hill country, though neither Moses nor the ark of the LORD's covenant moved from the camp. <sup>45</sup> Then the Amalekites and the Canaanites who lived in that hill country came down and attacked them and beat them down all the way to Hormah. <sup>1</sup> Korah son of Izhar, the son of Kohath, the son of Levi, and certain Reubenites—Dathan and Abiram, sons of Eliab, and On son of Peleth became insolent <sup>2</sup> and rose up against Moses. With them were 250 Israelite men, well-known community leaders who had been appointed members of the council. <sup>3</sup> They came as a group to oppose Moses and Aaron and said to them, "You have gone too far! The whole community is holy, every one of them, and the LORD is with them. Why then do you set yourselves above the LORD's assembly?"
