<u>Lessons from the Judges</u> Week #9 – Lessons from Samson Judges 13-16

Setting the Stage: Chapter 13
 Angel of the LORD is probably the Nazirite Vow: (13:5,7) Setting apart for being holy to the LORD (Numbers 6:1-2, 8) No dinking or eating anything from the vine (6:3-4) No the head (6:5) No touching the dead (6:6-7) Samson's Nazirite vow lasted his entire life (Judges 13:7) Samson's Nazirite vow was to deliver Israel from the Philistines (13:5)
Lesson #1 – God still uses for His purposes (14:1-4)
 Having a Philistine wife is certainly a problem (14:1-3) Philistines were not part of the list of peoples to not intermarry (Deut 7:1-3) Samson says that this woman is "" (14:3) How could God use Samson who is so stuck in His lustful and sinful ways? How does that affect our view of God's sovereignty?
 Samson's seeing things right in his eyes is the first verbal expression of wha has been slowly taking place in Israel's culture.
Lesson #2 – A life of lacking self-control leads to a life of habitual and greater sin
 Chapter 14:5-10 Carcass of the lion (15:8) – touching a dead thing Throwing a feast (15:10) – the word is used with the connotation of a He still has his hair Proverbs 25:28 "Whoever has no rule over his own spirit, is like a city broken down, without walls."
Lesson #3 – A culture totally given to sin will reject even God's
Lesson #4 – The past does not have to define your future.
- The consequence is great for Samson's sin – eyes gouged out, slavery, and praise of
BUT there is hope – Samson had a redeeming end. His hair started to grow back (16:22) He cries out to the LORD (16:28) Samson ends up being named in the hall of faith in Hebrews 11:32
