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Setting: Judges 6:1-10

- Again, we find Israel doing evil in the sight of the LORD
- Israel and Midian have a history together
  - o Midian is of the line of Abraham (Genesis 25)
  - Midian plays a huge part in enticing Israel to sin before God (Numbers 22 and 25).
  - Partial obedience is disobedience, and disobedience to God impacts future generations.
- The LORD's rebuke reveals that Israel's "crying out" was not over their sin (vs 8-10)
