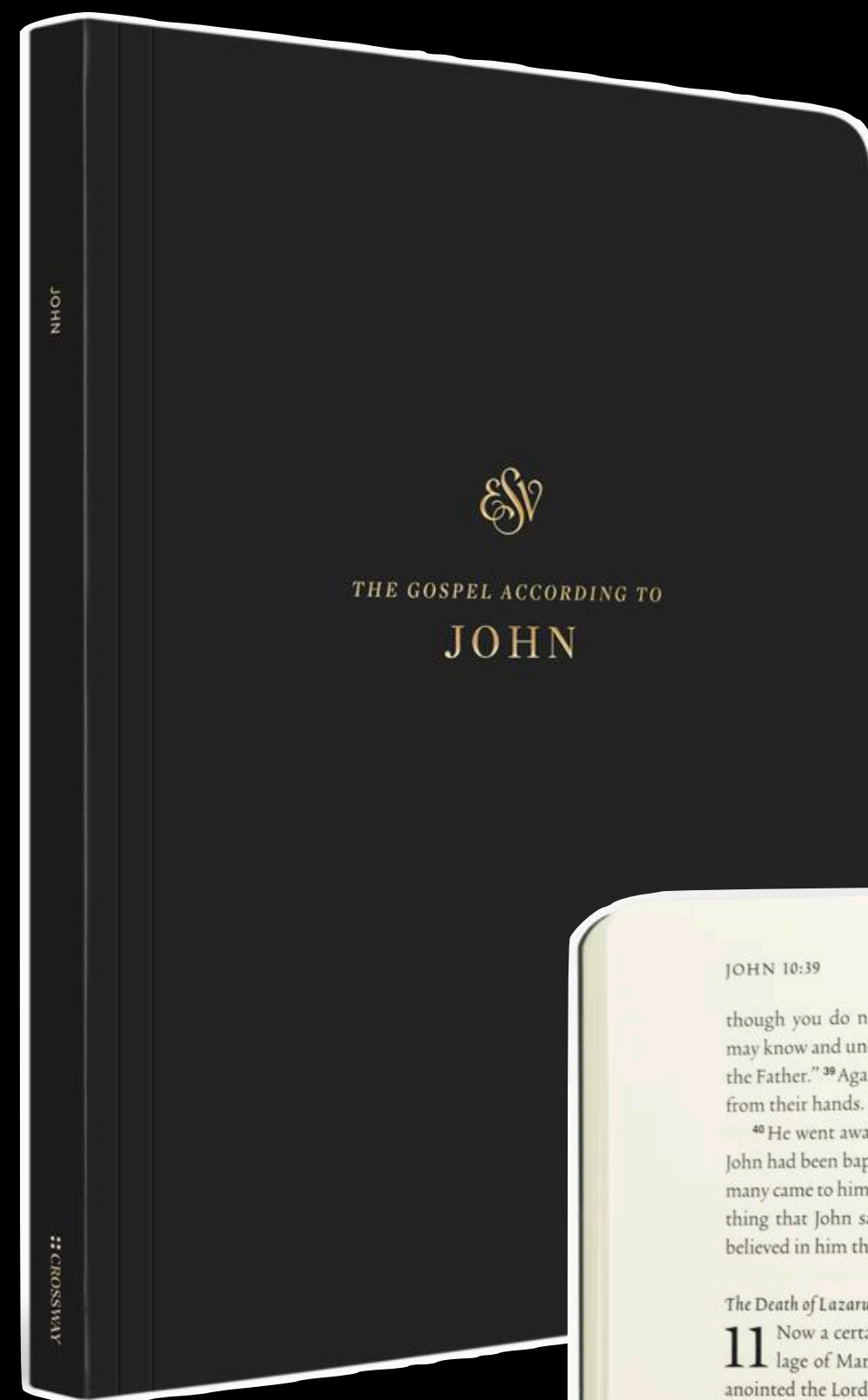




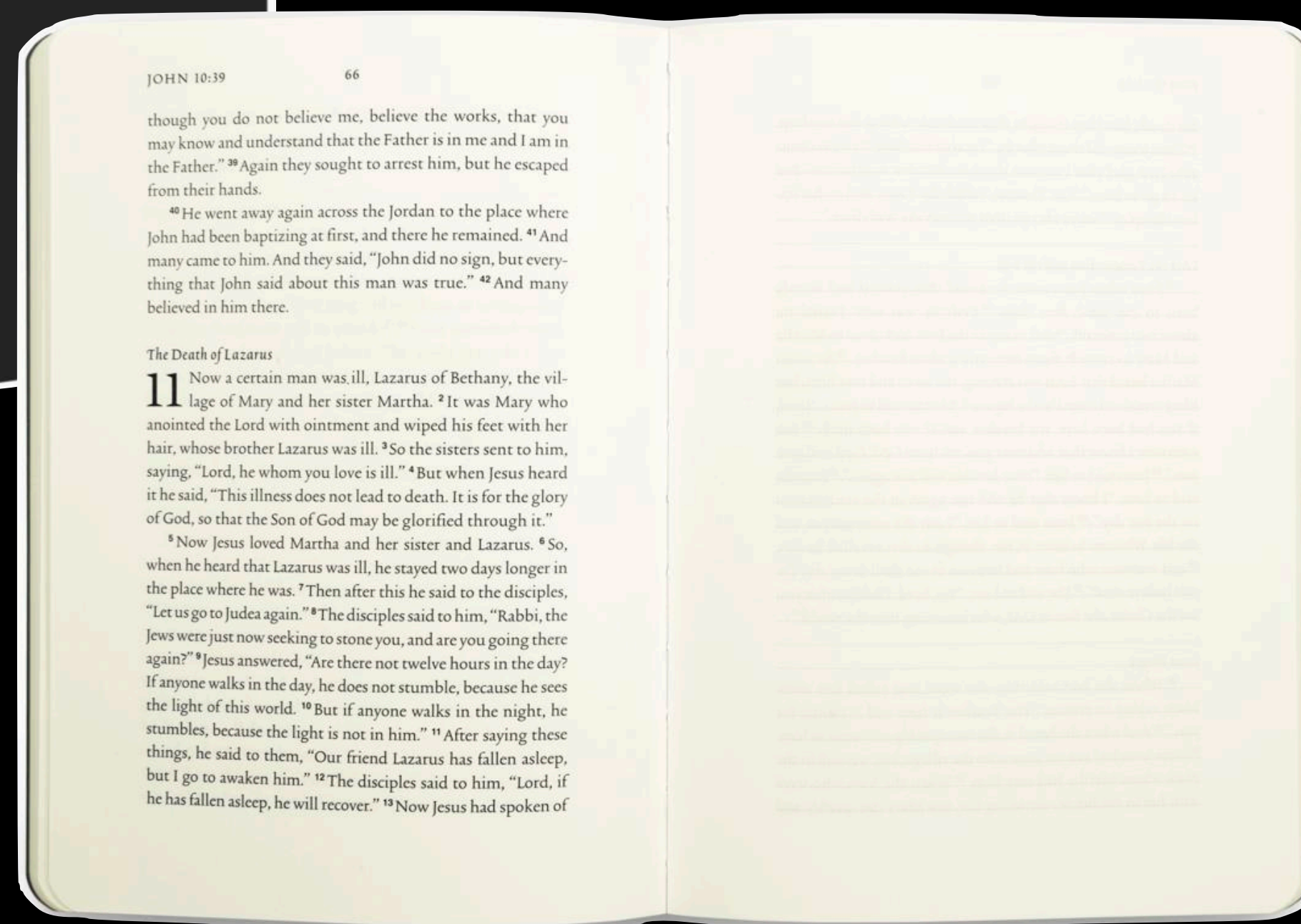

Purpose

Matthew's gospel was written to provide clarity and stability for the early church concerning the person of Jesus as Israel's **Messiah** and as **Head** of the Church.

Principle

To fully experience a relationship with Jesus, we must know and embrace him for who he truly is. Jesus is and will always be the promised Messiah King of Israel and all that he says and does comes from who he is.

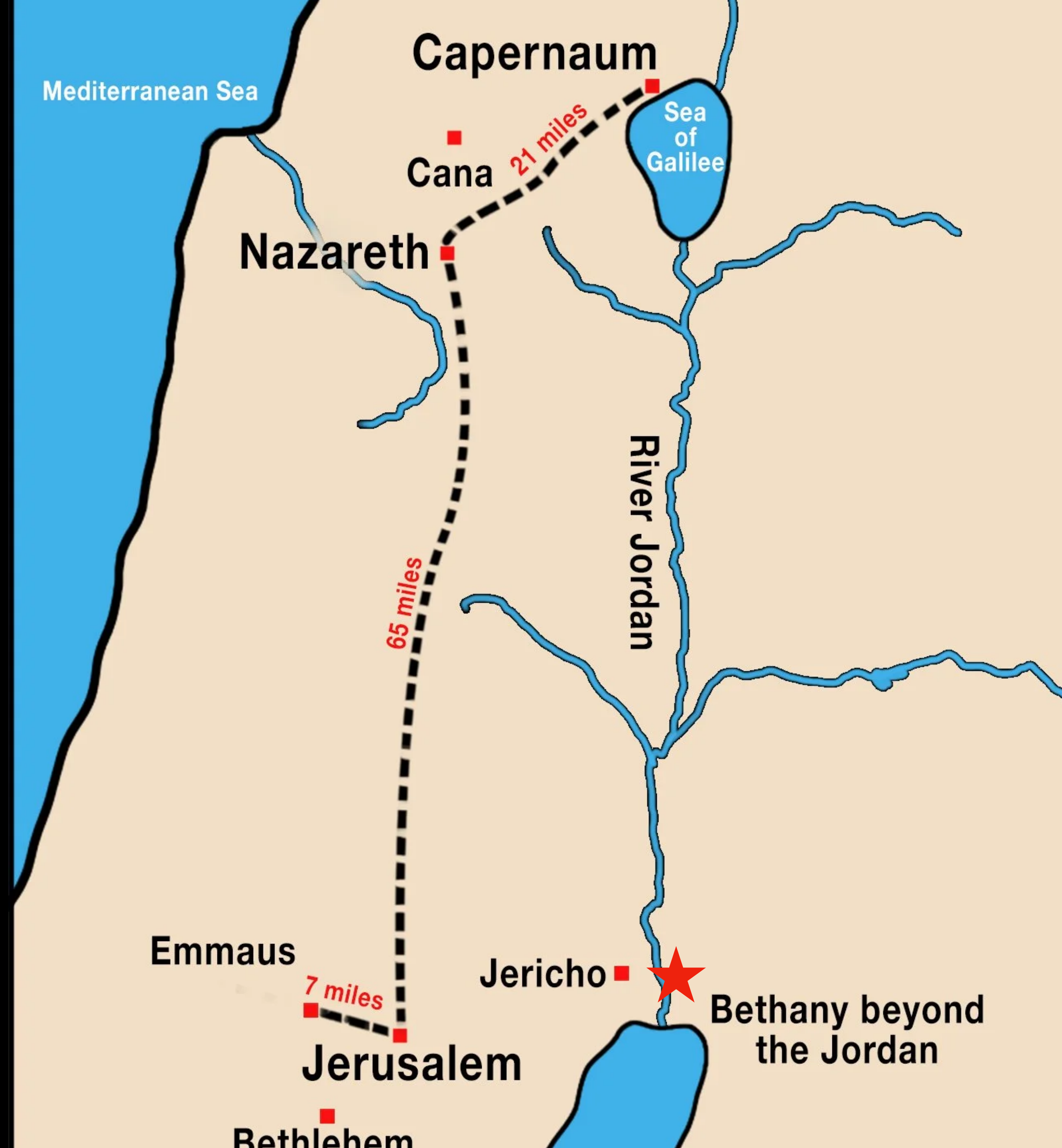
