

Expectation vs. Gospel Vision

Expectation: A belief that someone will or should achieve something. A belief about, or mental picture, of the future.



A behavior of spiritual maturity that you desire someone to perform for your benefit

Result: UNREST within you because you are depending on yourself to produce this behavior within the other person

A strong belief that something will happen or be the case in the future.



A place of spiritual maturity that you desire a person to be at for their benefit

Result: REST within you because you are partnering with and depending on God to work within the other person



Expectation vs. Gospel Vision

"Our expectations are not always correct because of flaws in our logic and the bias of hope and desire. Sometimes, we "get our hopes up" based on a false premise or a misreading of the evidence. Often, we form expectations automatically, without conscious effort. When expectations are not met, pain ensues, and we often place blame on something or someone who did not live up to our expectations—even if our expectations were unreasonable."

Why are we expectational?

Romans 7:21 I find then the principle that evil is present in me, the one who wants to do good. ²² For I joyfully concur with the law of God in the inner man, ²³ but I see a different law in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin which is in my members. ²⁴ Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from the body of this death? ²⁵ Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, on the one hand I myself with my mind am serving the law of God, but on the other, with my flesh the law of sin.
