## **Living Where He Lives**

As we begin to grasp this new paradigm of thinking, we must realize that transitioning into being a disciple of Jesus must be built on the life and role of Jesus. We are challenged to fully follow Him for where He is and what He offers us through His role.

In discipleship then, our aim is simply to live where Jesus lives and embrace His role toward us. Jesus also modeled a lifestyle that was led and empowered by the Holy Spirit. In the same fashion that the Spirit descended on Jesus at His baptism to empower Him, we too are empowered by the Holy Spirit. He is a promise to us and a down payment of a reality to come in the future, but the reality of that future can and must be pursued today. We are deeply changed and transformed as we grow in living in the interconnecting work of the Trinity in us. Jesus provides grace and truth to us through the empowering Spirit, all of which is always aligned with the will of the Father. The more we know and pursue this lifestyle, the more we attain to true life.
