Review

- → God's fundamental nature is relational
- things into existence
- → Men and women are fundamentally relational
- Men and women's primary relationship is to be with God
- → Men and women's secondary relationship is with others
- \rightarrow Men and women have unique roles that, when combined, give a fuller image of God's relational nature





Summary


- → Every sin is relational

 \rightarrow The pain of relational sin will always prompt a response relational unity toward self protection strategies


→ Subsequent responses involve more relational distancing resulting in strategies for self preservation and/or self




