


- ? What does this teach us about hope?

Principle

A hope-filled church is one that is informed of the predicted events that will usher in the Judgment of Jesus, and responds in motivation to live eternally sacrificial lives.

2 Thessalonians 2:13-17

13 But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth. 14 To this he called you through our gospel, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. 15 So then, brothers, stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by our spoken word or by our letter. ¹⁶ Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God our Father, who loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good hope through grace, 17 comfort your hearts and establish them in every good work and word.

But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved,

¹¹ Therefore God sends them a strong delusion, so that they may believe what is false, ¹² in order that all may be condemned who did not believe the truth but had pleasure in unrighteousness.

⁴ For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. ⁵ We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ, ⁶ being ready to punish every disobedience, when your obedience is complete.

¹⁵ So then, brothers, stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught by us,

either by our spoken word or by our letter.

¹⁶ Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God our Father,

who loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good hope through grace,

¹⁷ comfort your hearts and establish them in every good work and word.

What does this teach us about hope?

Thankfulness to God for the possibility and provision of a fruitful, eternally significant life for us is a massive relational motivator to pursue that very kind of life with and for Him.

The more we embrace this eternally significant life at an increasingly relational level with God, the more convinced we become of His character (faith) and the more we embrace His lifestyle (love).

Principle

A hope-filled church is one that is mindful of God's provision for eternal living; choosing to be thankful for and continually recommit to His unending power and equipping unto a rewardable life.
