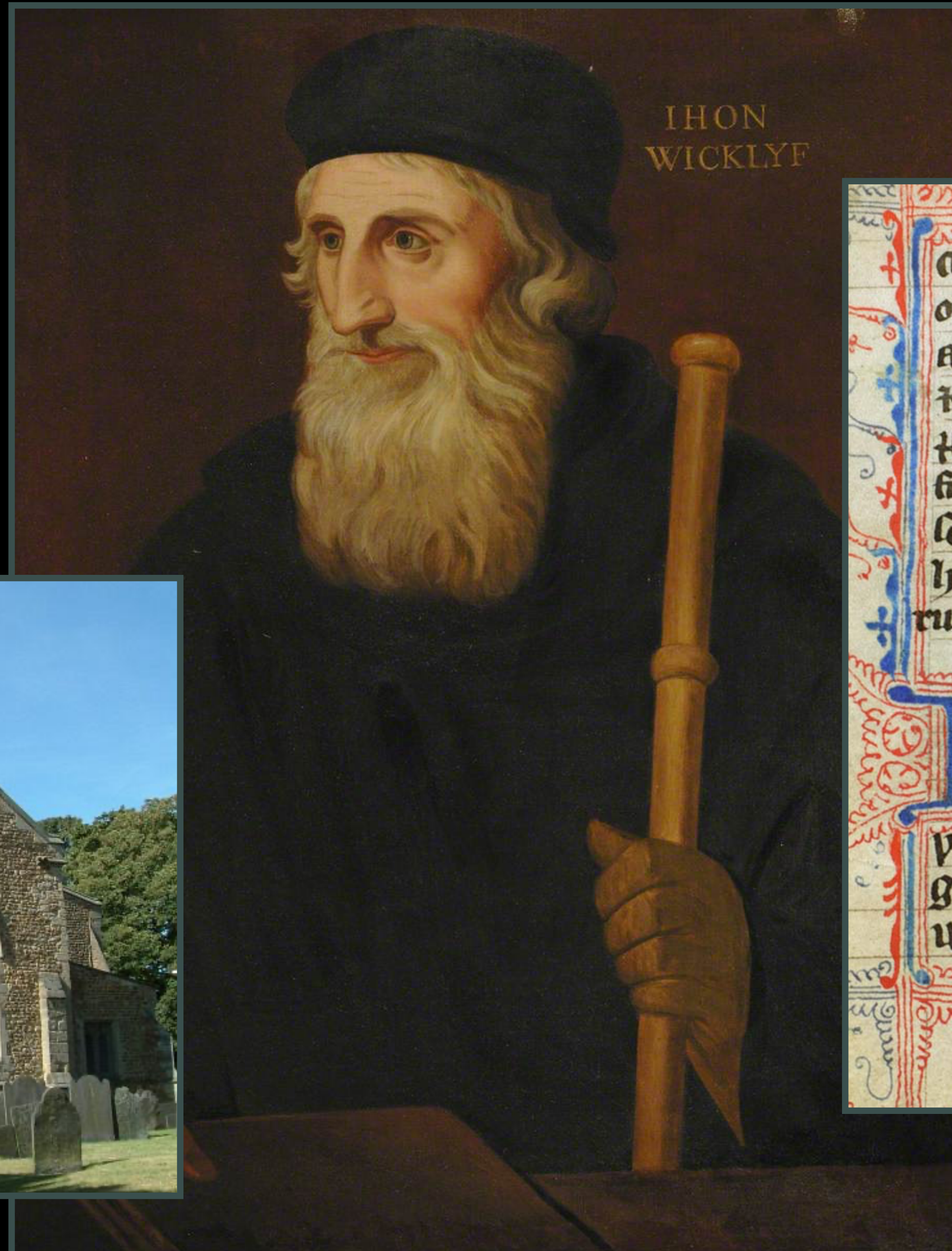

John 1:1-5, 14-16

2 Corinthians 10:3-6

³ For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh. ⁴ For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy **strongholds**. ⁵ We destroy **arguments** and every lofty **opinion** raised against the **knowledge** of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ, ⁶ being ready to punish every disobedience, when your obedience is complete.

2 Timothy 2:14-20

¹⁴ Remind them of these things, and charge them before God not to quarrel about words, which does no good, but only ruins the hearers. ¹⁵ Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth. ¹⁶ But avoid irreverent babble, for it will lead people into more and more ungodliness, ¹⁷ and their talk will spread like gangrene...²⁰ Now in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver but also of wood and clay, some for honorable use, some for dishonorable. ²¹ Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from what is dishonorable, he will be a vessel for honorable use, set apart as holy, useful to the master of the house, ready for every good work.

Jeremiah 15:16

GUIDELINES

Exegesis

The view that the meaning of a passage is derived, or “mined out”, from within the text. Exegesis views the passage as the container of the intended meaning of the original author (God through men), of which we as readers are meant to discover from within the text.

Eisegesis

The view that external presuppositions and knowledge are brought into the passage in order to come to an understanding of the meaning and application of a particular passage. To put it simply, eisegesis reads the meaning into the text.

Allegorical Hermeneutic

The allegorical hermeneutic primarily sees the Bible as a grouping of writings that present general ideas, and not as historical events and interactions between human beings and God at actual points in time and space.

Literal-Historical-Grammatical Hermeneutic

LHG employs a more of a plain sense assumption that the Bible, as it stakes its claims, represents actual recorded events in real space and time, and recognizes the presence and interaction of God in human history.
