



JESUS ON PRAYER – Pt. 5 Matthew 6:1





• We have addressed the Our Father in heaven and hallowing His name, His kingdom come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

SCRIPTURE

*Matthew 6:9–13 (NKJV) In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. 10 Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. 11 Give us this day our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, As we forgive our debtors. 13 And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

*INTRODUCTION

- This simple request could appear mundane after the grand sweeping acknowledgements of God the Father and hallowing His majestic person and existence.
- Then you consider God's Kingdom coming and His will being done throughout the earth
- The first half of Jesus' model prayer reminds us of <u>how big and great God is</u>, while the next section reminds us of <u>how intimate and personal God is</u>.
 - In this phrase, Jesus instructs us that God has a vested interest in our personal well-being!
- Jesus will be addressing our needs of 1) daily sustenance, 2) tranquility of soul, and 3) personal rescue from evil.
- Give us this day our daily bread is pertinent; it is always a relevant concern.
 - Instability in the world, our economy is always fragile, inflation has been an issue, the value or lack thereof of our currency, will be forced into a digital currency, or social credit system?
- No matter the era or location, daily provision matters to people. Does it matter to God? Let's find out

*God the Source – "Give us"

- The phrase begins with acknowledging God's giving to us, recognizing that God is the source of everything we receive.
- We'll discuss this further in a moment.

*God's People in Community – "Us" and "Our"

- Note that the prayer is meant to give us, not "Give me today my daily bread."
- God's kingdom is built on community. It is God's faith community—our families, our communities, and our nation.
- It is a prayer that acknowledges our dependence on God and our interdependence with each other.
- It is a prayer that opposes isolationism and individualism.
- It is a prayer that humbly recognizes reliance on God and interdependence on one another.

*<mark>God's Promise – God's Delight</mark>

God and Israel

 God established a personal relationship with Israel as their God, as seen in Exodus 19:5.

*Exodus 19:5 (NKJV) Now therefore, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people; for all the earth is Mine.

- God promised Israel that, as their personal God and leader, <u>He would do</u> three things for them.
- He would 1) protect, 2) provide, and guide them, as seen in Exodus 23:20 & 25.

*Protect:

Exodus 23:20 (NKJV) "Behold, I send an Angel before you to keep you in the way . . .

*Provide:

Exodus 23:25 (NKJV) "So you shall serve the Lord your God, and He will bless your bread and your water. And I will take sickness away from the midst of you.

*Guide:

Exodus 23:20 (NKJV) "Behold, I send an Angel . . . to bring you into the place which I have prepared.

 God delights in those who belong to Him. God, who is all-powerful, almighty, all-wise, and infinitely loving, promised that He would protect, guide, and provide! • God demonstrated the essential three duties of leadership: to protect, to provide, and to guide.

*God and New Testament Saints

- Jesus already established God's relationship with His people when He exhorted them to pray, Our Father, which art in Heaven.
- Jesus Himself referred to God as Abba Father in Mark 14:36.
- God has taken on Himself your well-being, provision, protection, and guidance.

*Matthew 6:30–32 (NKJV) Now if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? 31 "Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things.

• This is God's desire and love for His people.

*Our Responsibility

To Worship and Obey God

- God's promises are for His people who seek first God, His kingdom, and His righteousness.
- We observe the same in the Old Testament between God and His people.

*Exodus 23:22 (NKJV) But if you indeed obey his voice (the provided angel) and do all that I speak, then I will be an enemy to your enemies and an adversary to your adversaries.

Exodus 23:25 (NKJV) "So you shall serve the Lord your God, and He will bless your bread and your water. And I will take sickness away from the midst of you.

 So, whether it is Old Testament Israel or Jesus speaking to His followers, the most important lesson is that the security of provision comes from a Godcentered life that seeks to love and obey God!

*Deuteronomy 8:3–6 (NKJV) So He humbled you, allowed you to hunger, and fed you with manna which you did not know nor did your fathers know, that He might make you know that man shall not live by bread alone; but man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the LORD. 4 Your garments did not wear out on you, nor did your foot swell these forty years. . . . 6 "Therefore you shall keep the commandments of the LORD your God, to walk in His ways and to fear Him.

*Matthew 6:33–34 (NKJV) But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. 34 Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

- Notice again, an example of human-divine cooperation.
- Are you asking God for provision?
 - Devote your life to Him! Keep God at the core of everything you do.
 - You can confidently pray for your daily needs and trust in God's personal, caring presence and provision!
- God is your true source, not your employer, the government, or any other earthly agency. They may serve as tools, but He remains your ultimate source.
- Anyone, whether person, organization, company, or society, who follows God's order of life enters into God's realm of provision.
- Whenever the Christian faith has spread and been freely practiced, it has greatly benefited that society.
- The most important step a society can take is to permit the free preaching and living of the gospel.

*Daily Provision

Matthew 6:11 (NKJV) Give us this day our daily bread.

*The Scope

- The scope of the prayer is <u>daily</u> provision <u>each day</u>.
- *"Daily" in daily bread translates the Greek Word epiousios.
- Epiousios actually doesn't mean a 24-hour day. It signifies what is necessary for existence.
 - It's a request for what we need to keep our physical life going!
 - Jesus recognizes that we live physical lives.
 - We need sustenance physically.
- This context broadens our understanding of the deeper meanings behind "daily bread."
- Our needs go beyond physical bread; they include emotional, relational, health, shelter, and clothing needs.

*Peace in the Present

- This highlights our need to focus on the present.
 - We shouldn't worry too much about the future or dwell on the past.
 - This phrase teaches the importance of living intentionally in the moment, trusting God to provide what we need right now instead of giving in to anxiety about the future or regret.

*SUMMARY

- 1. Jesus teaches us to live in a state of continual, humble dependence on God.
 - It is a clear criticism of the modern mindset of self-reliance and hoarding mentality.
 - It is a prayer against pride that proclaims, "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me" (Deuteronomy 8:17).

2. *Jesus teaches us to sanctify the mundane.

- "Bread" symbolizes all our basic physical needs: food, shelter, clothing, and the health to enjoy them.
- By asking God for it, we recognize that even these simple, earthly things are gifts from His hand, making every meal a reminder of His grace.
- These are important to God; they are sacred!
- 3. *The words "our" and "us" remind us that this is not a solitary prayer.
 - It encourages a spirit of gratitude and shared responsibility, shifting us from a selfish focus on "my daily bread" to a Christ-like concern for "our daily bread."
 - It is a prayer that fosters both personal trust and community solidarity.

*APPLICATION

- 1. Trust in God's Love and Provision
 - Do you live with anxiety?
 - Do you walk intimately with God daily regarding your provision?
- 2. *Live in the Present
 - Do you live with anxiety regarding the future?

3. *Community Matters

- Although we need to practice personal trust, God has created us to live in community.
- Are you plugged into a ministry team, a small group, a band of brothers and sisters, or a network of families?

<u>We don't know what our future holds</u>. However, we can trust in our Heavenly Father, our Abba, our Creator God to be with us, to care for us, to provide for us!




