JESUS ON PRAYER – Pt. 2 Matthew 6:9





- We saw last week that Jesus desires to liberate people from praying so as to impress others and to draw attention to ourselves.
- We are also freed from repetitious and wordy prayers in a legalistic drudgery of an exercise.
- Jesus taught how not to pray!
 - In hypocrisy
 - For vain and temporal reward
 - Meaningless repetition
- Jesus gave a brief overview of how to pray.
 - Personal authentic prayer
 - To receive eternal reward
- Jesus' life affirmed the need and dynamics of prayer.
- If Jesus saw it to be such a necessity for Him and His earthly life, how much more
 do we who are sinners, though saved and forgiven, need to pray.

*INTRODUCTION

- Prayer was front and center in our national news this past week, related to the horrific and tragic shooting in Minneapolis. OUR HEARTS AND PRAYERS GO OUT TO THE FAMILY!!
- Minneapolis Mayor, Jacob Frey, in the heat of trauma and emotion of the tragedy, made a statement that was dismissive of prayer when he said, "Don't just say this is about thoughts and prayers right now. These kids were literally praying."
- Those sentiments were echoed, reinforced, and expanded by several high-profile leftist politicians, commentators, and influencers.
- Former White House Press Secretary Jen Psaki represented this sentiment when she said, "Prayer is not freaking enough. Prayers do not end school shootings. Enough with the thoughts and prayers."
- There was a tsunami-like reaction by religious leaders, conservative politicians, and conservative influencers. One of the more impressive responses came from Vice President J.D. Vance.

- We pray because our hearts are broken. We pray because we know God listens. We pray because we know that God works in mysterious ways and can inspire us to further action.
- At one time, prayer was considered a sacred act, highly regarded and valued, especially in times of difficulty and danger.
- Prayer is an international activity transcending hundreds of religions.
- Yet James states in his letter, chapter 5, verse 12:
- *James 5:16 (NKJV) . . . The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much.
- If James says that there is effective prayer, can we assume that there is ineffective prayer?
- What contributes to ineffective prayer, and what contributes to effective prayer?
- Luke's rendition of our current text helps us consider and interpret our text.
- *Luke 11:1–2 (NKJV) Now it came to pass, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, that one of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples." 2 So He said to them, . . .

*PRELIMINARY OBSERVATIONS

- 1. This is a pattern or model for prayer, not a prayer to be memorized and prescribed.
 - Luke 11 does not record the apostles saying, teach us <u>a</u> prayer, but teach us <u>to</u> pray.
 - In other words, what should characterize our praying?
- 2. *There are two thematic sections.
 - The first is God-centered and God-directed. vss. 9-10
 - The second is <u>God-centered and man-directed</u>. vss. 11-13
- 3. *The absence of singular personal pronouns; no "I," or "Me," or "My." (It is Godcentered & community-centered)
- 4. *Jesus did not teach. . .
 - Posture of prayer, stand, lift hands, sit, lie down, kneel, lift eyes, bow, face a certain direction, etc., are all found in scripture.
 - Place of prayer; during battle, in a cave, in a closet, garden,

- mountainside, sea, in God's house, in a personal residence, in a fish, in a prison, on a cross & etc., are all found in scripture.
- <u>Time of prayer</u>: early morning, mid-morning, 3 times a day, before meals, after meals, at the ninth hour, bedtime, midnight, in trouble, in celebration.
- Prescribed words for ritualized prayers.
- 5. *Jesus teaches on the *character of prayer*.

Our Father – The Relationship

- He introduces to us the character of prayer in that we address God as Father.
- **Prayer is built on the foundation of relationship** a relationship between God and people.

1. *Father and Children

- In the Gk., the word translated father is <u>Pater</u>, but many & most believe that, as Jesus also used Aramaic, a word most often used would be *Abba*.
- *Abba* is an affectionate term similar to the English term daddy. The difference is that this term continued to be used in the child's adulthood.
- Jesus uses it in Mk. 14:36 and Paul uses it in Rom. 8:15; & Gal. 4:6

*Romans 8:15 (NKJV) For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father."

- Abba in Aramaic, Pater in Greek; Abba! Father!
- We feel totally free and natural to come before God in an intimate and personal relationship, as indicated by the term *Abba*.
- Pater carries with it the weight of responsibility of a father. He is the protector, provider, and mentor.
- He is not passionless or indifferent, nor detached from us, His children.
 He is our Father, the perfect Father, personally and intimately involved in our lives.
- This is belonging, this is possession, home, refuge, resource, relationship.
- This is a wondrous intimacy with Creator God as our personal Father.
 - He is our Father, the perfect Father, personally and intimately involved in our lives.
- Jesus encourages us to go directly to the Father in prayer, in Jesus' name, and we will receive.

2. *Father and Benefits

a. We receive the Father's nature

*2 Peter 1:3–4 (NKJV) as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, 4 by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.

*b. We receive the Father's care

*Matthew 7:11 (NKJV) If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!

*Our Father – The Privilege

- "Our" Father Is Never Jesus' Own Expression.
 - As you read the gospels, you do not see Jesus addressing God in prayer or conversation with the plural possessive pronoun "Our".
 - You see "My" Father or "The" Father.
 - Then, in John 20:17, a most remarkable statement is made by Jesus!

*John 20:17 Jesus said to her, "Stop clinging to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to My brethren, and say to them, 'I ascend to My Father <u>and to your</u> <u>Father</u>, and my God <u>and your God</u>."

- WOW! Jesus' Father is your Father; God is your God!
- Jesus and Jesus only is God's begotten Son, His Son by right.
- Christians are His children by grace and adoption. Eph.1:4
- This is the most privileged gift this world can know.

*Hebrews 2:10–11 (NKJV) For it was fitting for Him, for whom are all things and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons to glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings. 11 For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one, for which reason He is not ashamed to call them brethren.

The Foundation of Prayer is a relationship with God. It is <u>personal</u> and <u>privileged</u>.

- Whether *rich or poor*, *ruler or peasant*, *black, white, red* or *yellow, male or female*, the playing field is level, in Christ God is our Father and our God, just like Jesus!
- We are all in the same strata of life. One that really matters, when you can look up and address God and say Abba! Father! Who art in Heaven.

Hallowed be your Name!

Hallowed Defined

- The root of the Gk. word from which *Hallowed* is translated is *hagios*.
 - Historically, it has been understood as sanctify, set apart, and set aside for a special purpose.
 - It has also been translated as holy or holiness, speaking of purity or to purify.
- In Matthew 6:9 the translators used the word *Hallowed*, because it can mean to revere or to regard with reverence that which is awe-invoking.
- This is closely associated with the Glory of God or the composite of all that God is in essence and person.

*Exodus 40:34–35 (NKJV) Then the cloud covered the tabernacle of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle. 35 And Moses was not able to enter the tabernacle of meeting, because the cloud rested above it, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.

• At Mt. Sinai, the people feared for the greatness and magnificence of God was on display, and they hallowed God for the glory of God that they saw.

*Hallowed Explained

- Glory is <u>from the Hebrew noun kavod</u>, which in the adjective means <u>heavy</u>, <u>weighty</u>, or <u>significant</u>.
- There is a reverence or hallowedness, a weightiness, a majesty of the person of God.

*Isaiah 6:1–5 (NKJV) In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His robe filled the temple. 2 Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. *3 And one cried to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!" 4 And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke. 5 So I said: "Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell

in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The LORD of hosts."

- The presence of God's Glory was heavy, and that is why they could not stand in the presence of God.
- Fear of God is healthy. Our lives, our families, and the Church must understand and live in the fear of God.
 - Whether God is hallowed is evidenced in life. AS God is regarded, so we live.
 - Willful disregard and disobedience are evidenced by the fact that man does not recognize God's as Holy and does not live in a healthy fear.
- It is the prayer of the one who has the right perspective of God that is effective.

*Revelation 4:8 (NKJV) The four living creatures, each having six wings, were full of eyes around and within. And they do not rest day or night, saying: "Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, Who was and is and is to come!"

- Prayer will be only as effective as God is Hallowed in our presence.
- Prayer is recognizing the majestic glory of God and Hallowing or revering in fear and respect Who He is.




