JESUS ON PRAYER – Pt. 6 Matthew 6:12

*REVIEW



- We have addressed the Our Father in heaven and hallowing His name, His kingdom come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
- We then looked at the components of prayer related to living for God's kingdom's presence on earth and His will be done on earth.
- Jesus then instructs us that God has a vested interest in our physical well-being when we pray, give us this day our daily bread.

SCRIPTURE

*Matthew 6:9–13 (NKJV) In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. 10 Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. 11 Give us this day our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, As we forgive our debtors. 13 And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

*INTRODUCTION

- The first half of Jesus' model prayer reminds us of <u>how big and great God is</u>, while the next section reminds us of <u>how intimate and personal God is</u>.
- Jesus addresses our needs of 1) daily sustenance, 2) tranquility of soul, and 3) personal rescue from evil.
- Jesus addresses a most central need in life, that of granting and receiving forgiveness.
- It is a most powerful weapon and resource in life, one the Enemy cannot counter!

*FORGIVENESS vs. 12

Matthew 6:12 (NKJV) And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

a penalty; to release from the legal penalties of an offense, to grant exemption, a warrant of remission.

*Forgiveness and God's Kingdom

- Forgiveness is an absolute foundational pillar in God's kingdom.
- Healing, restoration, freedom, and life are the fruit of forgiveness.

*Forgiveness and Satan's Kingdom

- On the contrary you will not find it at all in Satan's kingdom of darkness.
- Ruin, destruction, bondage and death are the consequences of unforgiveness.

*Practical Truths Related to Forgiveness

- The Enemy looks for a place of jurisdiction in believers' lives so as to exercise influence over them.
- One arena of legal jurisdiction Satan's kingdom gains in us is when we violate or commit sin against God or other people. Seeking forgiveness releases us.
- A second arena of legal jurisdiction Satan's kingdom gains is when we are violated with injustices and we carry sin responses such as unforgiveness.
- The bottom line is that unforgiveness brings ruin and death; forgiveness results in life and freedom.
- The person who is hurt the most with such an attitude is the one who has the unforgiveness.

*Vocabulary Context

 Today, we will dig into this verse, understand its profound meaning, and confront its extraordinarily practical implications for our lives.

*Debts

- *The word "debts" (from the Greek opheilemata).
- This is not a gentle suggestion; it is imperative or a command in its structure and epic in its implications.
- Luke's version of this prayer uses the word "sins," so we correctly understand that "debts" here represent our moral and spiritual failures against a holy God.
- But "debts" has a deeper, more impactful connotation.
 - A debt is something you owe.
 - When we sin, we fail to give God what we owe Him: our perfect obedience, our wholehearted love, our undivided devotion, and worship.
- This applies to the seemingly most petty sins as well as the most egregious sins.

*<mark>As</mark>

- *The second, crucial, word: "as" (from the Greek hos).
- This tiny conjunction is the hinge on which the entire verse turns. *It establishes a connection, a comparison, a condition.*
- The grammar is clear and intentional. We are asking God to forgive us in the same manner that we have forgiven others.

- Our receiving forgiveness is not independent of how we forgive others, but it is connected.
- This is breathtaking. In this prayer, we are not just recipients of grace; we are setting the thermostat for the grace we wish to receive.
 - We are asking God to mirror our own hearts back to us.

*Doctrinal Context

Mathew 6:12. . . forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

*Correlated Forgiveness

- Jesus knew this concept would be a stumbling block.
- Immediately following Jesus issuing His model prayer, He returns to this single point to emphasize it, lest we miss it in verses 6:14-15.
 - * "For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses."
- He leaves no room for ambiguity. Our forgiveness from God correlates with our forgiveness of others.
 - This is not because our forgiveness earns God's favor—salvation is by grace alone through faith alone.
 - Rather, it is because an unforgiving heart is a heart that has not truly comprehended, and therefore cannot truly receive, God's grace.

* Illustrated Forgiveness

- Jesus illustrates this truth in the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant in Matthew 18.
 - A servant is forgiven an unimaginable, unpayable debt—millions of dollars—by a merciful king.
 - That same servant then seizes a fellow servant who owes him a few hundred dollars and has him thrown into prison.
 - When the king hears of it, he is furious. "You wicked servant! I forgave you all
 that debt because you pleaded with me. And should not you have had mercy
 on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?"
 - The king then rescinds his forgiveness and delivers the man to the jailers.
- The application is unmistakable.
 - The one who has been forgiven a catastrophic debt but refuses to forgive a minor offense proves that he never truly appreciated the king's mercy.
 - · His heart was never transformed by it.
 - In the same way, a person who clings to bitterness, resentment, and unforgiveness toward another person is displaying a heart that has not been truly broken by the weight of their own sin against God.
- If we truly grasped the cosmic debt from which we have been released, forgiving our debtor's petty IOU would be the easiest, most natural response in the world.

*Applied Forgiveness

 So, what does this mean for us Monday morning? This verse shifts from being a theological idea to a sharp diagnostic tool for our souls.

1. Forgiveness is not a feeling; it is a transaction.

- We often think we haven't forgiven someone because we don't feel warm and fuzzy toward them.
- But biblical forgiveness is not primarily an emotion; it is a conscious, willful act
 of cancellation.
- It is the decision to wipe clean the ledger, to absolve them of the debt they owe you.
- You may still feel the hurt—the scar remains—but you choose to forgo your right to animosity or revenge, to hold it over their head, or to make them pay.
- You release them from your own personal courtroom.
- This is what we do "as we also have forgiven our debtors."

2. *Unforgiveness is spiritual cancer.

- When we refuse to forgive, we are not hurting the other person; we are poisoning our own souls.
- We are building a prison for another person and walking into it ourselves, locking the door from the inside.
- Bitterness corrupts our prayers, stifles our joy, and hardens our hearts to the Holy Spirit.
- It is the ultimate act of pride, asserting that our grievance is more profound than God's grace.
- It is a state of being that is incompatible with a redeemed life.

3. *Forgiving others is evidence of our revelation of God's grace.

- This is the core practical takeaway.
- You want to know if you've truly received God's grace? Look at your relational ledger.
 - Is there someone—a parent, a former friend, a spouse, a colleague—whose name you see and feel a spike of anger, a desire for them to "get what's coming to them"?
 - That bitterness is a spiritual alarm bell.
 - It doesn't necessarily mean you aren't saved, but it does mean there is a deep sanctification issue.
 - It reveals a part of your heart that is still clinging to the illusion of selfrighteousness and has not been fully captivated by the liberating truth that you are a debtor shown mercy.




