Point 1 – The Way of the Father is Compassion

- **Scripture:** Luke 15:3–7; John 10:11; Matthew 9:36
- Jesus tells the story of the shepherd leaving ninety-nine sheep to find the one. No ordinary shepherd would take that risk, but God's compassion is radical.
- The Father doesn't scold the sheep when He finds it He lifts it onto His shoulders and carries it home with joy.
- Jesus is the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep (John 10:11).

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Who are the people I'm tempted to "write off" or dismiss as too far gone?
- 2. Do I see struggling believers with compassion, or do I roll my eyes and grumble like the Pharisees?
- 3. How would my relationships change if I carried the Father's compassion into them?

Notes:

Point 2 – The Way of the Father is Persistence

- **Scripture:** Luke 15:8–10; Luke 19:10; Revelation 3:20
- The woman searches for her lost coin until she finds it. One coin might not sound like much, but in that culture it could be part of a dowry deeply valuable.
- God's pursuit is not casual; it's relentless. Jesus says, "The Son of Man has come to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10).
- God keeps seeking, knocking, and drawing people to Himself.

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Do I persist in prayer for lost friends, family, or neighbors, or do I give up too quickly?
- 2. Do I keep investing in messy relationships, or do I withdraw when it's difficult?
- 3. Where is God asking me to show persistence like His?

Notes:

Point 3 – The Way of the Father is Grace

- **Scripture:** Luke 15:11–32; Psalm 40:2; Romans 5:8
- The parable of the prodigal son reveals grace for both the rebel and the rule-keeper.
- Grace for the rebel: No pit is too deep for the Father's mercy (Psalm 40:2).
- **Grace in the Father's welcome:** He runs to the son, restores his honor, identity, and joy no probation, only full restoration (Romans 5:8).
- **Grace for the resentful:** The older brother stayed home but his heart was far away. The Father pleads with him too.

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Do I ever believe I've sinned too much to truly belong in God's family again?
- 2. Am I waiting to "clean myself up" before coming to God or am I letting Him meet me in the mess?
- 3. Do I struggle with resentment like the older brother, keeping score of what I think God owes me?

Notes:

Point 4 – The Way of the Father is Celebration

- **Scripture:** Luke 15:6, 9, 24; Zephaniah 3:17
- Every story in Luke 15 ends with rejoicing: "Rejoice with me!" Heaven throws a party when the lost are found.
- The older brother stood outside the party in bitterness. The Father pleads: "We had to celebrate."
- Celebration is not just relief it's God's delight in His children (Zephaniah 3:17).

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Do I truly celebrate when prodigals come home, or do I doubt their sincerity?
- 2. Do I rejoice when God blesses others, or do I feel overlooked and bitter?
- 3. How can our church reflect the Father's joy every time God restores someone?

Closing Reflection & Response

- We've seen the way of the Father: compassion, persistence, grace, and celebration.
- The story of Luke 15 forces us to ask: Where do I find myself?
 - Some of us are the younger son we've run, rebelled, and ended up in a pit. But the
 Father runs to us with grace and restores us fully.
 - Some of us are the older son we've stayed in the house, done the right things, but our hearts are cold, resentful, and bitter. The Father comes out to us too, pleading with us to share His joy.
 - Some of us are simply stuck we've lost sight of the mission, standing by while the Father calls us to seek the lost.
