When Truth Stumbles (Isaiah 59)

Statement: "There is a remarkable contrast between Jesus, who is the truth and speaks the truth, and the world which is opposed to the truth. The powers of the world—led by Satan—are opposed to God and His followers (Eph. 6:10-17). The things of the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride in one's possessions—do not come from God (1 John 2:15-17). The people in the world—those who are perishing—are blind to the truth of the gospel (2 Cor. 4:3-6). Therefore, Christians are called to live the truth and share the truth by resisting the powers of the world, rejecting the things of the world, and proclaiming Jesus to the world."

Key Verses: Isaiah 59:14-15 New Living Translation

14 Our courts oppose the righteous, and justice is nowhere to be found.
Truth stumbles in the streets, and honesty has been outlawed.
15 Yes, truth is gone, and anyone who renounces evil is attacked.
