  - b. What do you find difficult about Jesus' teaching here?
  - c. What excuses have you made to avoid forgiving others?
- 4. Read Matthew 18:23-35. From the sermon, explain the significance of the 10,000 talents and the 100 denarii.
  - a. According to v. 34-35, what happens to the person who consistently refuses to forgive? How do we reconcile this with Titus 3:5? Consider James 2:14, 17-18 and Matthew 7:16-20.
  - b. From the parable, whom should **you** identify with, and why should this transform the way you view forgiveness? Consider Colossians 2:13-14.



- c. What keeps you from being more amazed by how FORGIVEN you actually are?

6. Why do relationships that work require *limitless* forgiveness?

- a. Why does forgiveness not equal *forgetfulness* of past offenses?
