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a. Name several ways that your life is radically different from people living just 100 years ago because of technology.

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b. What changes have you made regarding technology since we began this series?

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c. Why do you think an *optimistic view* of technology is being encouraged throughout this series?

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2. Read 1 Corinthians 10:31. From the sermon, what types of ideas (meaning) are included in the term “glory” (doxa in Greek)?

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a. What does it mean to do something “to the glory of God”?

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b. Why is it a moral obligation for everyone to glorify God? Consider Romans 11:36.

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c. How is *glorifying* related to *sin* and therefore every single *problem* in life? Consider Romans 1:22-23.

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d. Read Isaiah 43:7. What is central to God’s *design* for humans? Why should we expect to truly LIVE when we engage in it?

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e. What do we learn about *the purpose (goal)* of the gospel as Jesus prays in John 17:1b?

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f. What *keeps* people from believing in Jesus according to John 5:44? Why?

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g. 1 Corinthians 10:31 says we should do “all” to the glory of God. Elaborate on what this looks like in daily life.

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h. When we fail to glorify God – how are you helped by reflecting on 1 John 2:1?

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i. How is it possible to do everything to God’s glory according to John 15:5 and Philippians 4:13?

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j. Why are you *excited* to work toward glorifying God in all circumstances – including *Social Media* engagement?

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3. Explain why the following questions are helpful for glorifying God on Social Media. Include examples for each question.

a. “What is *motivating* me to post this?”

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b. “Will what I *say* distract people from God’s glory?”

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c. “Can what I *say* direct people toward God’s glory?”

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d. “Will the *image* that I post distract people from God’s glory?”

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e. “Can the *image* that I post direct people toward God’s glory?”

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4. Why should we be patient with Christians who differ on what does and doesn’t glorify God on Social Media? Consider Romans 14:5, 12, 23.

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5. Why should we emphasize and celebrate God’s *original design* for humanity/the world/creation on Social Media? What are examples of doing the opposite of this? Why is this destructive?

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
