

Esther 5

- 1. What have you found uniquely helpful so far as we've studied Esther?
- 2. When it comes to the gospel, why is a word picture (illustration) worth 1,000 words of explanation?
 - a. Why don't we ever get beyond seeking more clarity from the gospel? Consider Romans 11:33-36.
- 3. Read Esther 4:13-5:1. Why was Esther in grave danger for approaching the King?
 - a. Read Acts 7:53, Colossians 2:14, Revelation 20:11,15 and 2 Corinthians 5:10. Why are we in grave danger *without* Jesus when we face God after death?
 - b. What set Esther apart from others when approaching the King?
 - c. What sets the people of Jesus apart from others when approaching God? Consider Isaiah 61:10;
 Zechariah 3:4; 1 Thessalonians 1:4-5; Ephesians 1:4.
- 4. Read Esther 5:2-3. What happens once the King sees Esther?
 - a. How does the King's response picture God's response to us through the gospel? Consider Ephesians
 2:8-9 and Titus 3:7.

- c. How does resting in God's grace toward me impact the way I relate to difficult people?
- d. How does *resting* in God's grace affect my response to trying circumstances?
- Read Esther 5:4-9. How does Haman's outlook paint a picture of WHY we need the gospel so much? Consider Matthew 24:37-39 and Proverbs 14:12.
- 6. Read Esther 5:9-14. Explain how Haman's pride both blinds and enslaves him.
 - a. Why is it foolish to read about Haman and simply look down at his foolishness?
 - b. What depths of evil might you have engaged in *apart from Jesus* if you didn't fear *consequences* and had *power* to do whatever you wanted? Why is the helpful to reflect on when we consider lost people around us?
- Explain how we've seen God quietly working to bring about His Master Plan from Esther 1-5 so far.
- 8. What stood out to you as uniquely helpful when pondering the gospel picture Esther and the King reveal?
