4.	Read Psalm 47 . The Psalms are worship songs, and we learn from them that clapping hands and singing loudly are ways to worship and celebrate God together. Have you ever resisted clapping or getting loud in celebration at church? If so, why is that?			
	a. Outside of church, where and when do you clap your hands or get loud in celebration (concerts sporting events, etc.)? Why do you do it?			
	b. Read 1 Samuel 16:7 . These expressions of worship/celebration are ultimately about our hearts. How can you use Psalm 47:1 to encourage you to step out in faith and clap your hands and get loud at times before God?			
5.	In verse 2, we see the reason for clapping hands and singing loud at times. It is not based on what we think we should do; it is based on WHO He is. He is LORD: eternal, self-existing, with personal loving care for each one of His people. He is the Most High: more worthy of praise and celebration than			

anything or anyone. He is to be feared meaning because of who He is you are afraid to live APART

He ultimately rules over our planet and everything in it.

from Him so you keep running closer and closer to Him. He is the great king over all the earth meaning
