3. Read Matthew 5:21-22. Why does Jesus take selfish anger toward others so seriously here?

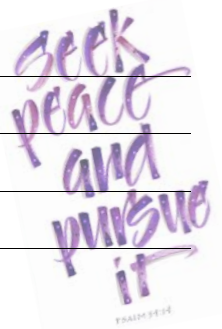
a. How is addressing this in my heart related to staying committed to others?
