

- 1. What does it mean to be an outcast?
 - a. Talk about a time when you felt like an outcast.
- 2. Read Mark 2:13-14. Explain what is significant about what Jesus does.
 - a. From the sermon, why were tax collectors despised by the Jewish people?
 - b. What do we learn about God since Levi/ Matthew (Matthew 9:9, 10:3) became one of the apostles and wrote a book of the Bible?
- 3. Read Mark 2:15. From the sermon, why this was so shocking?
 - a. What do you learn about Jesus as you meditate on the fact that He was building "relationships" with outcasts?
- 4. It's critical that we are salt and light while we build relationships with "outcast" (i.e. we are the influencers, not being influenced).
 - a. What are some indicators that you are being influenced by "outcasts"?
 - b. What are some indicators that you are exerting influence with "outcasts"?
 - c. What do you think it means to be a "moral snob" while relating to outwardly immoral people?
 - d. When do you struggle with being a "moral snob"?
 - e. What are some wise and gracious ways to respond to a "dirty joke" that someone just told you?

- f. What are some wise and gracious ways to respond to blatantly foolish comments someone makes?
- 5. What is unexpected about what we read in Mark 2:16?
 - a. Recall from the sermon what you learned about the Pharisees.
- 6. The Pharisees believed that they earned God's acceptance by their religious obedience. Why do you think this led them to look down on the tax collectors and sinners?
 - a. Why does seeking to earn God's acceptance by your obedience lead to pride or despair?
 - b. Do you tend to struggle more with feeling superior to others, or despairing of your failures? How does knowing "Jesus" earned God's acceptance <u>for you</u> free you from pride or despairing?
- 7. How does Jesus respond in Mark 2:17?
 - a. Why can "you" personally relate to outcasts like tax collectors and sinners (see Romans 3:9-12)? How does knowing *you* were an outcast before Jesus came and rescued you, impact your love for outcasts in society?
- 8. What would happen in Joliet if Mosaic Community was filled with people who loved outcasts like Jesus?
