C.	Tell of a time when you experienced unexplainable happiness while going through a hardship. What lasting change did that experience leave on you?		
d.	What do the apostles do after being beaten and released according to v. 42? Why?

a.	What truths do you need to stay focused on to rejoice when you suffer for Jesus?
