- 2. Read Genesis 1:26-27. Why is it critical to understand WHO we ARE before we can think clearly about technology?
  - a. What does it mean to be made in God's image?
  - b. Why is it the highest honor to be made in God's image?
  - c. Why does bearing God's image mean that *my* technology habits always affect *OTHERS* positively or negatively?
- 3. Read Genesis 1:28-31 (along with v. 26). What do we learn about what we should DO as God's image bearers?
  - a. What does this imply about natural resources throughout earth?
  - b. Why is this exciting?

- 4. Read Genesis 2:15. Why is this the beginning of farming?
  - a. Fill in the blanks for the internet definition of technology "science or knowledge put into practical use to \_\_\_\_\_ problems or \_\_\_\_\_ useful tools."
  - b. How is farming the first form of technology spoken of in Scripture?
  - c. Fill in the blanks from Tony Reinke's quote highlighting how developing technology is spiritual activity "The story of humanity tells the tale of how we have \_\_\_\_\_\_ to love each other more by \_\_\_\_\_\_ our skills."
  - d. How does a clear understanding of technology broaden your understanding for serving the Lord? (2)
  - e. What does it mean for you to *redeem* technology?

- a. How will this understanding *amplify* your worship toward God?
- 6. How should the construction of the Ark in Genesis 6 and the construction of the tower of Babel in Genesis 11 impact our thinking about technology?
  - a. In what sense did God save humanity by redeeming technology?
