

Main Point: Bad things sometimes happen to good people who've done nothing to deserve them.

Writer: The book doesn't name the writer.

Date: It's unclear when Job lived or when his story was written down. Several clues suggest Job lived about 4,000 lives ago, in the time of Abraham or earlier. Some clues: Job serves as the family priest apparently before an established priesthood, his wealth is measured by the size of his herds instead of his currency, and he is raided by Sabeans—a nation of tribes living in that era.

Location: Unknown. He lived in the land of Uz. But no one knows where Uz was.
