In the passage this week, Paul continues his assertion that we are justified and receive grace by faith in God's promises, and that has always been the case, even since the times of Abraham. Ted focused on the credibility we have to pay off our eternal debt vs Christ's credibility. In short, our credit line is zilch, nada, nothing, a big fat zero! Only Christ can cover our debt. Ted continued to give us 3 points of application: Let go of your list, live by faith, and accept the substitution.

1. Read Leviticus 18:1-5, Genesis 15: 1-6, Hebrews 10:1-18, and Habakuk 2:4. If faith has always been a means of receiving grace, what was the purpose of the law, why did God introduce it? Why is it important that Christ fulfilled the law? Does the law still play a role in the lives of Christians or Jews now?
2. Ted encouraged us to "let go of our list". What is the consequence of relying on a list to be a means of receiving grace? Read Luke 18:9-14. What strikes you about that parable? Does your heart reflect that of the Pharisee or tax collector?
3. As Christians we are to live by faith. Faith in what? How much faith and what kind of faith do we need to have? Read Matthew 17:14-20. Our faith will likely never be big enough to move mountains, but what is the result of the little faith we have, in this lifetime? Read Galatians 5:22-26
4. Ted's final point is to "accept the substitution" (V 13-14). Is trusting in Christ a one time thing? Consider, will you trust in Christ or continue to trust in yourself?
