Ted, in his sermon uses an illustration to describe life. Everyone is a farmer and life is a field. In the harvest we will reap what we have sown in the field. Have we sown according to the flesh or to the spirit? According to Romans 3:23 we have all sown seeds of the flesh. The good news is that through repentance and faith in Jesus Christ we all can reap what Jesus has perfectly sown in the field. The Apostle Paul thus encourages us not to give up on doing good to others and to the church.

1. If we have all sown according to the flesh, and Jesus has paid the debt on our behalf why should we do good to all? Read Romans 8: 4-8 and Ephesians 2: 10. In what ways may doing good to all maybe hard in certain situations? Are some people “too far gone”? Do we write them off as undeserving? In what ways do you struggle with doing good to all?
2. Ted mentions this quote in his sermon *“For it is disgraceful that, when no Jew ever has to beg, and the impious Galilaeans support not only their own poor but ours as well, all men see that our people lack aid from us.”* -- Julian the Apostate. Doing good to all is a testimony of Christ’s goodness to all people. In what ways can you testify to each other of the goodness you have seen in each other or other believers that testify of Christ’s goodness?
3. Ted’s second application is to do good to God’s people. Read 1 John 4: 20. If we love God and we are sowing to the spirit, we should be loving God’s people. In what ways can we love God’s people, and why is this important?
4. Read Galatians 6: 9-10. The Apostle Paul reminds us not to give up for we will reap a good harvest if we sow to the spirit through repentance in Christ. In what ways do you ever have the temptation to give up? Where can you testify in your own life about enduring through a situation where it may have been easy to give up that God brought you through?
