

Acts 27 *The God of Storms – Life lessons from the storm*

NOTES

Acts 27:1-44 Paul is sent to Rome (*by way of a ship from Alexandria, Egypt*)

1. Paul was delivered to a Roman centurion for travel by ship to Rome.
2. God's man warned of great peril while the majority spoke of peace and safety.
3. When the south wind blew softly, the worldly rebels assumed they were right.
4. God brought a tempestuous wind in a moment of time called Euroclydon.
5. There was no human ability to control the ship in the midst of the storm.
6. When all hope was taken away, it was time for a message of hope in God.
7. After fourteen nights, the hopeless shipmen tried to escape their own way.
8. Paul warned the centurion, "Except these abide in the ship, ye cannot be saved."
9. God's promise of protection and safety allowed Paul to be thankful in the most challenging part of the storm – the fourteenth night!
10. God was faithful as promised – the ship was broken; the people were saved.
