Keys to remember as we approach this next topic...

- When proper discipleship takes place, the disciple will grow through a seven stage process as he or she walks with God.
- This pattern was established by the Lord Jesus Christ with His twelve disciples and then with the seventy.
- These same seven stages can be observed in the development of the apostle Paul.
- It is important for us to understand these stages and identify where we are in our personal walk with Christ.
- Close observation of any Christian will reveal their present stage of spiritual growth.
- This process is not only for pastors, missionaries or those who are called to vocational ministry. *This process should unfold in the life of every believer.*

6. Spiritual Development and Reproduction (also known as the NT Process of Discipleship) The Seven Stages of a Disciple (follower; learner) a. #1 - The starting point God desires all men to repent and be saved - Mt. 4:17; Acts 17:30-31; 2 Pet. 3:9 Repent means to CHANGE directions - Mt. 21:28-29 Genuine salvation will lead to a changed life - 2 Co. 7:10 #2 - Getting to know God This is the time to "learn of Him," not to get head knowledge of the Bible. In order to be a participating servant (minister) in a local church you MUST first have a relationship with Jesus - Phil. 3:10-11 Jesus desires us to know who He is - John 1:1-5, 14; 35-48 One on one discipleship with a mature believer is God's plan - 2 Ti. 2:2 This often happens by accident – we want to do it by design! 1 Ti. 1:16 #3 -Life (Ministry Training) - Applying what you know to life Motivation toward public ministry - 2 Co. 5:14 Knowledge brings ACCOUNTABILITY... - Lk 12:48 Knowledge brings the desire to pass on what has been learned. REPRODUCTION will result as the follower gets involved publically - Lk. 10 Practical life application of biblical truth will be observable in disciple's life: Follows Christ in **OBEDIENCE** (baptism; giving; etc.) Follows Christ in **SUBMISSION** (attitude) Col 3:22-23 Witnesses to others – Acts 4:20 Struggles with problems as the Devil attacks – 2 Tim 3:12; I Cor 15:58 #4 -Training - Identifying where each believer fits in the body Leadership is the key to success - Prov. 29:1-2 Only a good *follower* can be a leader. Those who do not properly respond to training have **no** business whatsoever in leadership. Mk 9:35 True leaders will always be found **TRAINING** others. KEY True leaders will have followers. False leaders will have "BLIND" followers. Jesus' focus was to develop leaders to lead others.

	 God proves (TESTS) every disciple - 1 Peter 1:6-7; 4:12-13 This testing is <i>not</i> like the normal problems of everyday life. This testing is <i>not</i> connected to sin in the disciple's life. This testing involves a <i>crisis</i> that leads to a "point of no return." The test leads to an "all our nothing" attitude. The results: A completely transformed life that will NEVER be the same. A natural separation from the world
	 The proper foundation of strong biblical discipleship is key at this point because everyone will eventually come to this crossroad. This is to be expected, do not be surprised.
	- This proving is often intense and severe - John 6:66-70; 1 Kings 2:1-6; Job 13:15.
#6 -	in leadership – The DEVELOPMENT of others
	 The disciple has clear evidence of <i>fruit</i> in his/her life. John 15:5 This is the time each disciple assumes greater responsibility. The disciple now lives out their decisions made during testing time. This stage is important because you must put into practice what has been learned. No one can properly lead until it is put into PRACTICE. There are no textbooks that can make a person a leader, it must be learned by experience. Leaders exemplify maturity in their character (<i>temperance</i>, <i>compassion for others</i>, <i>empathy</i>, <i>tolerance to differences</i>) - Mt. 15:21-32; 20:30-34; 23:37; Luke 19:41-42
#7 -	Spiritual maturity towards our mission
KEY	 All major principles of the Christian life have been learned and practiced. The disciple knows what he/she is to do because they know God. The disciple has a testimony in life that speaks louder than words. Mt 5:16 The disciple lives from the fruits of his labors - 2 Ti. 2:6; 1 Co. 9:1-7, 14; Joshua 5:10 12; 3 John The disciple can be commissioned to reach the WORLD and is expected to
	accomplish that mission.
Summarizing the Christian life (Spiritual Development and Reproduction)	
-	Not everyone is called to vocational ministry (pastor or missionary), but everyone is called to the ministry. EVERYONE can do something important for God. How this calling works out practically in the lives of people will obviously differ. However, EVERY believer should come through this process successfully. God gave us a Book and placed His Holy Spirit inside us at the moment of salvation, there is no excuse.
KEY	Through good times and bad, the key is to always be found " with God."

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
