Mark 4 – The Parable of the Sower (part 3) – Rootless!

INTRODUCTION

We are studying the Parables of Jesus beginning with *The Parable of the Sower*. Jesus said it was key to understanding all parables!! Tonight, our focus is the 2nd "ground" where the seed was sown – the STONY GROUND. If you have ever heard a person say they were a Christian and their life did NOT **PROVE** it, they may just be a **stony ground** hearer. Every person in this room is represented in one of these four types of heart soils. This could be the most important message you will ever hear.

SCRIPTURE COMPARISONS

Mark's Gospel

Parable Mark 4:5-6 – And some fell on stony ground, where it had not much earth; and immediately

it sprang up, because it had no depth of earth: But when the sun was up, it was scorched;

and because it had no root, it withered away.

Interpretation Mark 4:16-17 – And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when

> they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness; And have no root in themselves, and so endure but for a time: afterward, when affliction or persecution ariseth

for the word's sake, immediately they are offended.

Matthew's Gospel

Parable **Matthew 13:5-6** – Some fell upon stony places, where they had not much earth: and

forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth: And when the sun was up,

they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away.

Interpretation Matthew 13:20-21 – But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that

> heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it; Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is

offended.

Luke's Gospel

Parable Luke 8:6 – And some fell upon a rock; and as soon as it was sprung up, it withered away,

because it lacked moisture.

Luke 8:13 – They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy: Interpretation

and these have **no root**, which **for a while believe**, and **in time** of temptation **fall away**.

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PREACHING NOTES

- 1. The **second** soil where the seed of the word of God was sown was **on <u>STONY</u> ground**...
 - ✓ There are **immediate**, **outward signs** of conversion as this person **springs up quickly**.

 John 7:24 (Judge not according to the appearance); 1 Thes 5:21 (Prove all things); Isa 11:3, 4; Jas 2:1, 4, 9
 - ✓ They receive the word with gladness and joy a shallow <u>UNDERSTANDING</u> (no depth of earth). Mark 6:20 (Herod heard John gladly); 10:17-22; Ezek 33:31, 32; Acts 8:13, 18-21 (Simon); 24:25, 26 (Felix)
 - ✓ They have **not counted the cost** of surrendering all to the **LORD** Jesus Christ. Luke 14:26-35 (*counteth the cost*); Joshua 24:19-24; Luke 8:13 (*for a while believe*); Jas 2:19, 26; 1 Jo 2:19
 - NOTE The stony ground hearer is not initially offended by the word of God. In fact, they are quite the opposite. Because there is not much earth (as they have not counted the cost), they immediately give the appearance of someone who is truly saved or born again. However, as we will see, the proof of who they are lies in the future. Do not be fooled.
- 2. Because there is **no <u>ROOT</u>**, when promised **affliction**, **persecution**, **tribulation** and **temptation** comes, the **false convert** will "wither" or "fall away" having never truly been "in Christ."
 - ✓ Jesus is called **the <u>ROOT</u>**, and **the VINE**. Isaiah 11:10 (*a root of Jesse*); John 15 (*the vine*); Rom 11:16-18; 15:12; Rev 5:5; 22:16; Eph 3:17; Col 2:10
 - ✓ If you do not have **the ROOT** <u>in you</u>, you <u>CANNOT</u> <u>be saved</u>.

 John 1:12; Romans 3:24 (*in Christ*); 8:1; 12:5; 16:7; 1 Corinthians 1:2, 30; 15:22; 2 Corinthians 2:14; 5:17; Galatians 1:22; 3:26, 28; 6:15; Ephesians 1:1, 3, 10, 12, 20; 2:6, 10, 13; 3:6; Philippians 1:1; 4:21; Colossians 1:2, 4, 28; 2:5; 1 Thessalonians 2:14; 4:16; 1 Tim 3:13; 2 Tim 1:1, 9; 2:1, 10; 3:15; 1 Peter 5:14
 - ✓ The <u>SUN</u> is promised <u>affliction</u>, <u>persecution</u>, <u>tribulation</u> and <u>temptation</u> <u>for the WORD'S sake</u>. Isaiah 25:4; Jonah 4:8; Ps 1:3, 4; 92:13-15; 2 Tim 3:12 (all that will live godly); Heb 12:6, 7 (chastening)
 - ✓ The **SUN** <u>reveals what we cannot see</u> **the** <u>TRUTH</u> <u>behind the appearance of a believer</u>. Matthew 7:15-20 (by their fruits ye shall know them); Romans 7:4; Proverbs 6:23 (the law is light)

NOTE The seed that falls on the stony ground heart does not take root and produce fruit. They remain unconverted. This person will deceive believers (who will not witness to them because they profess to be saved) and will be a stumbling block for unbelievers who say, "If this person is a Christian, I do not want it." It is time to speak the truth in love. We must stop calling people "saved" who do not prove it. If there is <u>no</u> FRUIT ... there is <u>no</u> ROOT!

Matthew 7:16 ... ye shall know them by their <u>fruits</u>.

Romans 7:4
... that we should
bring forth fruit
unto God.

What are the *fruits* of someone who is soundly saved? (Rom 7:4; Mt 7:15-20)

- ❖ The fruit of repentance Mt 3:8; Lk 19:8
- ❖ The fruit of good works Col 1:10; Titus 3:8; Mt 5:16
- ❖ The fruit of thanksgiving Heb 13:15; Eph 5:19-20; Rev 5:9-14
- ❖ The fruit of the Spirit Gal 5:22-23; Eph 5:8-9
- ❖ The fruit of righteousness Phil 1:11; Heb 12:11; Jam 3:17-18; Ps 23:3; Prov 8:20

❖ What did God say to you through His Word today? **Examine yourselves. Repent and obey God.**
