It is built on **seven hills** - Rev. 17:9


It is drunken with <u>the blood of the saints</u>, and <u>the martyrs of Jesus</u> - Rev. 17:6

"Of the different articles of attire specified for the Pope to wear when installed into office, five are scarlet. A vest covered with **PEARLS** and a mitre adorned with **GOLD** and precious stones was also to be worn." ⁴

Alexander Hislop states:

"The Apocalyptic emblem of the *Harlot* woman with the cup in her hand was even embodied in the symbols of idolatry derived from ancient Babylon, as they were exhibited in Greece; for thus was the Greek Venus originally represented, and it is singular that in our own day,...the *Roman Church* has actually taken this very symbol as

her own chosen emblem. In 1825...Pope Leo XII struck a medal, bearing on the one side his own image, and on the other, that of the Church of Rome symbolized as a "*Woman*," holding in her left hand a *cross*, and in her right a *cup*, with the legend around her, 'Sedet super universum.' (Meaning) "the whole world is her *seat*." ⁵
