INTRODUCTION

Last week, we studied two faithful servants – Timothy and Epaphroditus – and learned how God uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things and different callings and faithfulness to build His church. Today, we will be challenged to reassess what we value and what matters most in our lives. When Jesus Christ changes our VALUES, we learn to recount life differently – what once mattered becomes loss and knowing Him becomes our greatest GAIN. Our past, our present, our pursuits, our future... must all be reevaluated in light of the clear teaching of the word of God. This is God's message to you...

❖ The Text Philippians 3:1-21

The Turning Point

As Paul was "going up"

in this world, he met

a man "coming down"

– Jesus Christ the Lord!

A. Recounting the Past – What I once valued (3:1-6)

- 1. Religious heritage, achievements, and self righteousness once **DEFINED** Paul.
 - **Philippians 3:2 Beware** of <u>dogs</u>, **beware** of <u>evil workers</u>, **beware** of <u>the concision</u>.
 - Philippians 3:3 For we are THE CIRCUMCISION which worship God in the spirit...
 - **Philippians 3:4** ... If any other man thinketh... **he might trust** in the flesh, I more:
 - Philippians 3:4-5 Circumcised the eighth day,

of the stock of Israel,

of the tribe of **Benjamin**,

an **Hebrew** of the Hebrews;

as touching the law, a Pharisee;

Concerning zeal, **persecuting the church**:

touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless.

Old Testament Example: King Saul – *1 Samuel 9-15*

✓ He was tall, strong, outwardly impressive, but trusted in <u>HIMSELF</u> more than God.

Personal Application

You must **beware** of trusting in **you**, in **your** flesh, good works, or religion **instead of Christ**.

B. Recounting the Present – What I now value (3:7-11)

2. After salvation, Paul realized everything else is loss compared to **KNOWING** Christ.

"But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ."

What a thought! Paul was "going up" in this world and met the Lord of glory coming down to men! Talk about a complete reversal in life and thinking! Amen. Amen. What happened to you on that day?



Saul of Tarsus

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Hebrews 11:26

Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward.

- Philippians 3:8 Yea doubtless, and I <u>COUNT all things but loss</u> for the EXCELLENCY of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and <u>DO COUNT them but dung</u>, THAT I MAY WIN CHRIST.
- Philippians 3:9 And be found IN HIM... but that which is through the faith of Christ...
- Philippians 3:10 That <u>I MAY KNOW HIM</u>, and <u>the power of his resurrection</u>, and <u>the fellowship of his sufferings</u>, being made <u>conformable unto his death</u>:

Old Testament Example: Moses – Exodus 2-3; Hebrews 11:24-26

✓ He esteemed the reproach of Christ *greater riches* than the **TREASURES** of Egypt.

Personal Application

Following Christ may cost you comfort, reputation, earthly gain, but the value of knowing Him surpasses all! What has it cost you? Integrity over promotion? Purity over pleasure?

C. Recounting the Pursuit – What I strive for (3:12-16)

- 3. Paul was not striving for perfection but pressing **FORWARD** toward Christ-likeness.
 - Philippians 3:12 Not as though I had already attained... perfect: but I follow after...
 - Philippians 3:13 Brethren, I COUNT not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, FORGETTING THOSE THINGS WHICH ARE BEHIND, and REACHING FORTH UNTO THOSE THINGS WHICH ARE BEFORE,
 - **Philippians 3:14** I **press toward the mark**... the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.
 - Philippians 3:15-16 Let us THEREFORE... be thus minded... let us walk... let us mind...

Old Testament Example: Joshua & Caleb – Numbers 13-14

✓ Unlike the others, they kept pressing forward toward God's **PROMISE** by faith.

Personal Application

The Holy Spirit leads us FORWARD – not backward. You cannot live in the past! Press on in prayer, the Bible, obedience, service. Keep pursuing Christ even after failures and setbacks.

D. Recounting the Future – What I anticipate and hope for (3:17-21)

- 4. Paul was **HEAVENLY** minded and *looking for* the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ!
 - Philippians 3:18 (For many walk...told you... WEEPING...enemies of the cross of Christ:
 - Philippians 3:19 Whose end is destruction... belly... shame, who mind earthly things.)
 - Philippians 3:20-21 For our conversation is <u>IN HEAVEN</u>; from whence also <u>WE LOOK</u>...

Old Testament Example: Abraham – Genesis 12; Hebrews 11:9-10, 15-16

✓ He lived in tents, looking for a heavenly city whose builder and maker is God.

Personal Application

We live differently when our eyes are on heaven. Be less earthly minded, more heavenly minded; less materialism, more generosity; less fear, more faith. What is your life like?

"For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Saviour..."

God has helped us to recount our life His way – quit your confidence in the flesh, treasure Jesus Christ above all, keep pressing forward toward Him, and live with heaven and Jesus Christ in view. How then ought you to live differently? What is God telling you to do? Obey Him.
