#### WHY STUDY PROPHECY?

At least 25% of the Bible is prophecy.

"That's just your interpretation."

A text without a context is a pretext for a proof-text.

When the plain sense makes good sense, seek no other sense lest you end up with nonsense.

# "The Bible is the literal Word of God"

- Pew Research (2017):
  - 31% Yes
  - •33% No
- Gallup (2017):
  - 24% Yes (lowest in 40 years)

#### **Two Methods**

1. Allegorical

2. Literal

# **ALLEGORICAL METHOD**

A secondary, spiritual meaning.

 Context is denied, deemphasized, or ignored.

# ALLEGORICAL METHOD DANGERS

- It does not interpret Scripture.
- Authority placed on the interpreter, not Scripture.
- Conclusions cannot be tested.

### LITERAL METHOD

Historical-Grammatical Method


- Considers grammar and history in proper context.
- Basic meaning of words in normal, ordinary, customary usage.

### LITERAL METHOD

- Accounts for allegories, symbols, figures of speech, and types.
- This method keeps a check on mankind's imagination.
- This method is consistent with the inspiration of Scripture (2 Tim. 3:16; 2 Pet. 1:21).



Eschatology derives from one's hermeneutics:
