

Summary

The sermon focuses on the concept of spiritual refinement, using Malachi 3:1-3 as the main text. Pastor Carter explains that refinement is a necessary process for spiritual growth, comparing it to how precious metals must go through fire to be purified. He emphasizes that God uses trials and challenges not to punish believers, but to purify them and make them more effective witnesses for His kingdom.
