PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS Pastor Gul was arrested and sentenced to six years in prison for the activity of his Christian faith. His elderly parents, brother and sisters continue to gather for worship with other Christians in their small, rented home, although the constant judgment and scrutiny from the community have created an atmosphere of anxiety and distress for them They expressed both deep pain and joy that Gul "had been chosen by God to bear his name and bring hope and the gospel to inmates." In a recent visit, Gul reminded his father of the story of Joseph. He expressed that he, like Joseph, is in prison for a divine reason. He was confident God would use his time in prison to bring glory to his name and lead many to salvation in Christ. Pray for Gul's faith to shine brilliantly in the darkness of prison and for his family to remain steadfast and encouraged.



## Talking about **The Ten Commandments**

## 13 How many kinds of law did God give?

God gave three kinds of law: 1) The ceremonial law; 2) The civil law; and 3) The moral law.

### 14 What were the ceremonial and civil laws?

The ceremonial and civil laws in the Old Testament showed the Hebrew people how they should worship God and how they should behave themselves in their tribes.

## 15 What is the moral law?

The moral law tells me about my duty toward God and my fellow human beings.

### 16 Which of these laws is still in effect?

The New Testament shows us that only the moral law is still binding. The ceremonial and civil laws no longer apply (Ephesians 2:14-18).

Hebrews 7:18-19 "For on the one hand, a former commandment is set aside because of its weakness and uselessness (for the law made nothing perfect); but on the other hand, a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God.

## The Lord's Supper

#### Who may participate?

This sacrament is meant for believers in Jesus Christ (I Corinthians 11:27-29). It is the way that God unites His church, sustains the church and grows faith, hope and love as the church participates in this shared grace together. Communion is God's way of delivering assurance of the forgiveness of sins to the flock.

#### What is received?

Christ gives to the communicants His body and blood - in, with, and under the bread and wine. He declares the forgiveness of sin to all believers, and strengthens their faith.

#### I feel I'm unworthy to receive

Being unworthy of Jesus' body and blood is the primary reason to receive the forgiveness of sins promised in communion. But it is possible to receive communion with an unworthy attitude. Therefore, self-examination is called for (I Corinthians 11:28, 31).

#### I do well to ask myself:

I. Do I believe Jesus' promises? "Without faith it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6).

#### 2. Do I recognize Jesus' presence?

"Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself"

3. Am I reconciled with my fellow believers? If we do not value reconciliation with others, we put ourselves in a place where we are distancing ourselves from God's will for us. We are living in rebellion.

#### 4. Do I recognize my sinfulness and that it will be the death of me? (1 John 1:5-10)

#### 5. Is my hope in Jesus alone as the one who can give me eternal life?

We invite those who confess Jesus as their Savior from sin and death to receive the gift of forgiveness of sins offered and gifted in this sacrament.

#### A Note for Parents

Because communion requires time for self-examination, we do not encourage communion for children until they are old enough to be taught and old enough for self-examination. Through teaching they will appreciate its significance. Catechism Classes provide an opportunity to learn about the Lord's Supper. These classes are taught with the use of Luther's Small Catechism ...
