COMING CLEAN

(2 Samuel 12:1-15)

1.	We need to come to our own CONCLUSION about our own sin. (1 John 1:9; Proverbs 28:13; Acts 19:18; Psalm 139:23-24; Psalm 51)
2.	Seeing someone else 'wearing my SIN ' looks hideous. (Exodus 22:1; Matthew 7:5, 15:7-9; Romans 2:3)
3.	Course correction comes by the Holy Spirit through the WORD of GOD . (2 Timothy 3:16-17; Proverbs 6:23, 15:32; Psalm 119)
4.	Getting tripped up in my own pursuits requires me to reject and refuse the abundant GOODNESS of God. (Isaiah 8:6-8; Ephesians 3:20; Jeremiah 1:16, 3:20, 31:32; Deuteronomy 32:18; John 12:46-48)
5.	There are times you have to CONFRONT someone and help them see their sin, and we need others to do the same for us. (Galatians 6:1-2; Ephesians 4:15; Matthew 18:15; Luke 17:3; James 5:19-20; Proverbs 27:5-6; Hebrews 3:13, 10:24; 1 Thessalonians 5:14; 2 Corinthians 2:4)
6.	What we spend so much time and energy hiding will be EXPOSED . (Numbers 32:23; Luke 12:2; Job 13:23; 2 Timothy 3:5; Matthew 23:27; Ecclesiastes 12:14; 1 Corinthians 4:5)
7.	Come clean, and experience the <u>MERCY</u> and <u>GRACE</u> of God. (Ephesians 2:4-5; Psalm 51; Psalm 32: Isaiah 53:4-6; Micah 7:18-19; Psalm 103:12; James 2:13)

6.	In what ways did God show His mercy in the midst of judgment? David wrote Psalm 51 in response to the revealing of his sin. What do we learn from this Psalm about confessing, repenting, and receiving mercy and grace? (So, what is the difference between mercy and grace?)
