



1. The risen Savior fills us with His VICTORY over sin, death and Satan. (Colossians 2:11-15; John 11:25; Hebrews 2:14-15; 1 Corinthians 15:55,57; 1 John 4:9-10, 5:4; Romans 8:1)
2. The risen Savior fills us with NEW LIFE - now! (Romans 6:4; 2 Corinthians 5:17; John 1:12-13; John 1:16; Hebrews 7:25; Romans 8:34; John 3:3,16, 5:24; 1 Peter 1:3; Galatians 2:20)
3. The risen Savior fills our FUTURE with security. (1 Corinthians 15:20-22; Revelation 21:5; 1 Peter 1:4; 2 Corinthians 4:18; Romans 8:23; 1 Thessalonians 5:10)
4. The risen Savior draws NEAR to us and draws us NEAR to Him. (Matthew 27:50-51; Hebrews 4:16,10:19,22; Matthew 28:9; Luke 24:15,19,36; John 20:27, 21:12,19; James 4:8; Psalm 145:18)
5. The risen Savior fills us with His peace and COMFORT. (Matthew 28:10; John 20:16; Luke 24:36,38; John 20:19; 2 Corinthians 1:3; Psalm 23:4, 34:18; Psalm 119:50; Matthew 5:4)
6. The risen Savior opens our EYES and fills our MINDS with understanding. (Luke 24:27,29,31,45; John 16:7,14; 2 Kings 6:17 ; Psalm 119:18; Acts 26:18; Ephesians 5:8)
7. The risen Savior fills us with holy MISSION. (Matthew 28:10; Luke 24:46-49; John 20:21; 2 Corinthians 5:21-22; Matthew 28:19-20; Luke 19:10; Matthew 24:14)

1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
  
2. Jesus died on the cross for our sins, but it doesn't (and can't!) stop there. On Sunday, Pastor John said that "Jesus dying on the cross was the payment, and His resurrection from the grave was the receipt for that payment". What might this mean? Why is 'dying for our sins' not enough?
  
3. Romans 6:4 says "that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." Based on this verse, is it possible here and now to walk in newness of life? What prevents us as believers in the risen Christ from walking in newness of life?
  
4. In what ways is there an inseparable bond (such a powerful relationship) between what Jesus has done / has completed for us and the mission to which He has called / commissioned us?
  
5. In moments of personal encounter, Jesus drew near to Mary Magdalene, Thomas, Peter, all the disciples, and others. In what way(s) has Jesus drawn you near / drawn near to you recently? How has this impacted your daily living? Your outlook? (In what ways do you need Him to draw near to you right now? Take this opportunity to pray for one another...)
