


1.	We are not to quarrel, despise, pass judgment, or disassociate with fellow believers over differences of OPINION or matters of personal CONVICTION . (1 Corinthians 10:23-33; Ephesians 4:2; Titus 3:9-11; Proverbs 20:3; 2 Timothy 2:23; Hebrews 12:14; James 4:12)
2.	Whoever God <u>WELCOMES</u> I should <u>WELCOME</u> . (Acts 10:13-15; Mark 7:18-19; Matthew 7:1-2, 15:11; 1 Timothy 4:3-5; Romans 15:5-9; Luke 9:48; John 13:20)
3.	WHATEVER I DO (or refrain from) should be intentionally, directly, and actively done (or refrained from) to intentionally, directly, and actively HONOR GOD. (Colossians 3:23; Acts 17:28; 1 Corinthians 6:19,20, 10:31; Philippians 2:10-11; Isaiah 45:23; 1 Peter 2:12)
4.	We must RESOLVE to do nothing that will cause a brother or sister to get TRIPPED UP in their walk with Christ or to be BURDENED unnecessarily. (1 Corinthians 8:9-13, 9:1-15; Galatians 5:13-15; Luke 17:2; 1 Corinthians 15:33)
5.	Laying down my RIGHTS , PRIVILEGES , and PREFERENCES for the sake of others is a great way to honor God and build up others. (1 Corinthians 8:13, 9:1-23, 10:32; Luke 9:24; John 15:12-13; 1 John 3:16; Romans 12:10; Philippians 2:3; 1 Peter 2:16)
6.	If we are not convinced that what we are about to do does not miss God's mark, then DON'T DO <u>IT</u> . (Hebrews 11:6; James 4:17; 1 Timothy 1:5; 2 Corinthians 5:7)

4.	On a different note, when (if ever) should we exhort others and lovingly challenge them to a higher standard? (Support your answer with Scripture.)
5.	Why is it so difficult to lay down our rights, privileges, preferences, and opinions and so easy to insist upon them and push them on others? Why is the former necessary in living out our faith? Why is the latter so destructive?
6.	Give some examples of 'reeling in' my freedoms in order to not cause a brother or sister to stumble.
7.	When it comes to living by our convictions, how do we balance being <i>fully convinced in our own mind</i> (verse 5) with not <i>quarreling with, despising, or judging</i> (verses 1, 3, 4) a brother or sister?
