

- Because of God's presence and power, nothing will successfully <u>OPPOSE</u> me. (v.31; Romans 8:1, 18, 26, 28; Joshua 1:5; Isaiah 8:10, 54:17; Psalm 27:1, 56:9, 91:1-16, 118:6; 1 Peter 3:13; Zephaniah 3:17; Hebrews 13:6; Revelation 12:10)
- 2. Because of God's gracious **PROVISION**, I will lack nothing I '**NEED**'. (v.32; Matthew 6:31-33, 7:11; Philippians 4:6; 2 Corinthians 9:8; Psalm 23:1, 34:10; Hebrews 13:5; Luke 12:24; 2 Peter 1:3; John 10:10)
- 3. Because God is the judge, no one will successfully **ACCUSE** or **CONDEMN** me. (vv.33-34; Isaiah 43:25, 50:8-9; Psalm 32:1-2, 103:12; Micah 7:18-19; 1 Corinthians 1:8-9; 2 Corinthians 1:21-22; Colossians 2:13-14; 1 John 3:20)
- 4. Because of God's **KEEPING**, nothing will **SEPARATE** me from Him. (vv.35-39; Psalm 44:22, 103:17; Matthew 5:10-12; 2 Corinthians 4:8-9; 2 Timothy 3:12; Isaiah 43:2; Psalm 23:4)
- 5. We have as an assurance the <u>UNLIMITED</u>, <u>EVERLASTING</u>, and <u>UNCHANGING</u> love of God. (vv.35,39; Psalm 13:5, 63:3, 86:15, 103:17, 136:26; Isaiah 54:10; Jeremiah 31:3; Ephesians 2:4-5; 1 John 3:1; John 15:13)
- 6. Through Christ, we have an overwhelming <u>VICTORY</u> in all things. (v.37; 1 John 4:4, 5:4-5; 2 Corinthians 2:14; 1 Corinthians 15:57; John 16:33; 2 Timothy 4:7-8; Psalm 44:5-7; Deuteronomy 20:4; Jeremiah 9:23-24; Revelation 12:11; Psalm 60:12)

1.	Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
2.	Verse 33b says "It is God who justifies." Thinking back to our study in Romans, what does this mean? How can a better understanding and embrace of this truth help us when we sense guilt, failure, or condemnation - whether from ourselves or from others?
3.	In what ways can 'bad experiences' with love (from others) influence the way we receive and live in God's love for us? Many things may have 'separated us' from the love of other people, but God's Word says clearly that NOTHING can separate us from God's love. In what ways does the assurance of God's love help us when we face opposition, accusation, guilt, condemnation, loneliness, etc.?
4.	It is one thing (a very great thing!) to be a conqueror. It is another to be more than a conqueror. What does it mean to be more than a conqueror? Why might Paul have worded it this way? What was he trying to communicate? Why was this important to the Christians in Rome at that time? Why is it important to us today?
