2.	Approach life as a <b>NEW CREATION</b> . (vv.14-15, 17; Romans 6:2-4; Galatians 2:20; Ephesians 2:1, 4:22-24; Romans 12:2; John 3:3,6; Romans 10:9; John 1:12,13; 1 Peter 1:3,23; Titus 3:5; Acts 2:38)
3.	Approach life with greater <b>SURRENDER</b> . (vv.14-15; 2 Corinthians 1:8,9; James 1:22, 4:7; Matthew 16:24-25; Proverbs 3:5-6; John 4:34; Matthew 7:21; Romans 12:1; 2 Timothy 1:12; Jeremiah 10:23)
4.	Approach <u>OTHERS</u> ! (vv.18-21; Acts 8:29-39; Psalm 66:16, 105:1-2; Luke 8:39; John 1:40-45; John 6:8-10; 2 Corinthians 3:5; Romans 5:8,10)
