

OUR UNSTOPPABLE GOD!

(1 Samuel 14:1-23)

1. God's **METRICS** are not our **METRICS**. (*2 Peter 3:8; Judges 7; Isaiah 55:8-9; 2 Samuel 24:10*)
2. **TALK** about **TRUST** can be cheap if we don't put our full weight into it! (*James 2:18,26, 4:17; Hebrews 11:1; 2 Corinthians 5:7; Matthew 17:20; 1 Thessalonians 1:3*)
3. We all need a brave and loyal armor bearer to **GO WITH US**. (*John 15:12-13; 1 Thessalonians 5:11; Ecclesiastes 4:9-10; Proverbs 18:24; Romans 12:10; 1 Peter 4:8-10; Hebrews 10:24; 1 Corinthians 15:33*)
4. We need to exercise faith to take the **NEXT STEP** and trust God to direct the remaining steps. (*Psalm 32:8, 37:23-24, 119:105; Proverbs 3:5-6, 16:9; Isaiah 30:21; Jeremiah 10:23; John 14:26*)
5. Moving forward in faith doesn't mean the **WAY** will be smoothly **PAVED**. (*John 15:20, 16:33; Psalm 23:4; Matthew 7:13-14; James 1:2-4; 2 Timothy 3:12; Matthew 5:11-12, 16:24-25; 2 Corinthians 1:3-4; Philippians 1:29*)
6. God can **SHAKE** the ground and **CONFUSE** the plans of our adversary. (*2 Thessalonians 3:3; Matthew 6:13; 1 Corinthians 10:13; Proverbs 18:10; Psalm 18:2, 59:1; Acts 16:26*)
7. **SALVATION** comes from the Lord! (*1 Thessalonians 5:24; Isaiah 12:2; Psalm 3:7-8, 27:1, 62:1-2, 68:19; Micah 7:7; Habakkuk 3:18; Acts 4:12*)

1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
2. Why did Jonathan not tell his father (Saul) his plans? Do you think this was wise? Respectful? Why? Why not? What might have happened had he told Saul? What would you say if your child quoted this verse to you as 'support' for not telling you something important?
3. In **verse 6**, Jonathan affirms that *nothing* can stop the Lord from saving. If we believe this is true, why do we frequently live like it is *not* true? What might 'living like this is true' look like? What did God do in these verses that Jonathan, even though he was a man of action, could not have done? What is something that seems almost impossible right now that God is fully able to provide for, overcome, etc.?
4. What lessons do we learn from Jonathan's armor bearer? Why is it important to have someone like this in our life? To be this type of person for someone else?
5. What leadership qualities do we see in Jonathan? How can we emulate these in our lives and spheres of influence today?
