1.	God is bestowing and has promised a fuller RICH INHERITANCE to His children. (v.11-12; Ephesians 1:17-19)
2.	The inheritance given by the Father can be SQUANDERED . (v.13-14; John 15:4; Matthew 25:14-30)
3.	The path of self-sufficiency leads to CONSEQUENCES . (v.15-16)
4.	Knowledge of who God is and His promises gives ILLUMINATION . (v.17-20)
5.	Our Father shows COMPASSION to His children. (v.20-21; 1 John 3:1)
6.	The Father robes us in MERCY and gives us the very best. (v.22-24; 1 Peter 2:9)
7.	It is easier to be BLIND to our own prodigal story when we point the finger at others. (v.25-30)
