2.	Satan slowly chips away at our faith by convincing us a little compromise is okay .
3.	When we <u>decide</u> for God, God <u>provides</u> for us.
4.	God <u>placed</u> you in this culture at this <u>time</u> because you have something <u>unique</u> we need to <u>hear</u>
5.	The next time you feel <u>unsettled</u> by this society just <u>remember</u> you are not home yet.

6. We are in **Babylon**, but Babylon does not have to be in **us**.

4.	Daniel thought it was important not to defile himself by eating the king's food. He would not compromise his faith for the sake of food. Can you think of other examples in scripture of people that did not compromise their faith, and some that did? What are some examples today in which we are tempted to compromise our faith? (Daniel 1:1-8, 1 Peter 1:22-25, 1 Peter 3:13-17, Colossians 3:5, 1 Kings 18:21, James 4:4, Matthew 6:24)
5.	What was Daniel's diplomatic response when he was asked to compromise his faith? Have you been tempted or even asked to do something that goes against your faith? How did you respond? (Daniel 1:8-14, Luke 14:15, 1 Corinthians 10:13, Matthew 6:13, Matthew 26:41, Hebrews 4:15)
6.	When you hear the words "This is not your home," how does that make you feel? How did Daniel respond to the Babylonian society that was clearly not his home and against God? What can we

learn from Daniel? (Philippians 3:20, Hebrews 13:14, 1 Peter 1:4, Revelation 21:2, Ephesians 2:19)
