ROMANS 10: 14-21

1. Each and every believer in Jesus Christ is a **SENT ONE**. (John 17:18, 20:21; Isaiah 6:8, 52:5; Nahum 1:15; Matthew 9:36-38; Mark 4:35; Luke 19:10)
2. There is more to the picture than **SHINING** our Godly character: we must **SPEAK** the message that has to be heard. (Matthew 5:16; 1 Peter 2:9; Mark 11:3, 16:15; Matthew 28:19-20; Psalm 96:3, 105:1)
3. Let's not let a **LACK** of **CONCERN**, belief, or obedience in others stop us from speaking the wonderful **WORDS** of **LIFE**. (Ezekiel 2:2-7; Isaiah 58:1; Jeremiah 1:17, 26:2; Acts 4:20, 5:29; 2 Timothy 4:2; 1 Corinthians 9:16; Luke 10:16; Galatians 6:9)
4. Let's not let how others see us (even as **FOOLISH**) stop us from sharing a message of God's **POWER** for **SALVATION**. (Romans 1:16; 1 Corinthians 1:18-31, 3:19; John 15:18-19; 2 Timothy 3:12; 1 John 3:13; Matthew 10:22; Galatians 1:10; Luke 6:22; Philippians 1:29)

1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
2. "Preaching the gospel is the pastor's and missionary's job." Do you agree or disagree with this statement? Explain. In your explanation, incorporate Matthew 28:19-20 and Mark 16:15.
3. In verse 19, Paul quotes Moses relaying God's message that He would make Israel "jealous of those who are not a nation" (see Deuteronomy 32:21). Why would God make someone jealous? What is God's heart in this matter?
4. What would you say are the top 3 reasons you might be hesitant to verbally share the gospel message with others? Why are these a problem for you? How might you be able to overcome these hesitations?
5. The Jews considered the Gentiles as "foolish". Likewise, many (perhaps most) in our society today consider Jesus-abiding Christians as foolish (see 1 Corinthians 1). What should our heart be for people who think this way? Should this discourage or encourage (deflate or inspire) us as "sent ones"? Explain.
6. Jot down the name of (just) one person with whom you could share the gospel. Lift this person's name to the Lord and pray for God to inspire you to yield to what He would have you do.
